ARPC BYLAWS

(Amended & Approved May 9, 1994)

Article (c) PAYMENT OF FEES, BILLS & DEBTS:

NO obligations, fees, bills or debt under \$100.00 will be incurred by any **CLUB** member except upon approval of the President. **NO** debts shall be incurred beyond \$100.00 except upon approval of the **Executive Committee**. This bylaw will be enforced. So if you spend it, get approval first or you may be making a donation to the club. Normal monthly bills, will be paid by the treasurer, all others must be approved first. (above emphasis is mine)

OREGON ASSOCIATION OF SHOOTING RANGES

A Division of Oregon State Shooting Association

The Executive Board of ARPC has asked me to summarize an issue before the e-board for your consideration and vote at our next general meeting on March 8, 2004.

Oregon State Shooting Association, (OSSA) seeing a definite need for a more effective way to deal with shooting range issues, has organized the Oregon Association of Shooting Ranges, (OASR). OASR is a division of OSSA.

OASR currently has five ranges enrolled. Big Timber in Siletz, Tri-County in Sherwood, Canby R&G Club, LaGrande R&P Club and Jefferson State in Klamath Falls. Several more are planning on joining soon. Recruitment is ongoing.

Our Mission Statement is as follows.

Forum of Oregon Shooting Ranges for the promotion of:

1. Firearms safety and training.

2. Best Management Practices for Shooting Ranges.
3. Preservation of existing ranges and development of new ranges.
4. Communication between ranges on common issues.
5. Shooting Sports.
6. A favorable public image of shooting ranges.

Dues to OASR are based on the membership of the joining range. Each range is charged \$2.00 per member. Of that two dollars, 25% goes to OSSA into a range fund to be used on projects benefiting shooting ranges, to establish communication for OASR, for the web space on OSSA's web site and inclusion in the OSSA newsletter The Straight Shooter.

The other 75% is deposited into the OASR checking account to be used by the OASR Board to achieve the goals of the organization.

Each range appoints one member to serve as Director on the OASR Board.

The OASR Chairman serves as a Director on the Board of OSSA.

By consolidating our resources and joining together, Oregon shooting ranges can better deal with environmental and political issues as well as building membership, promoting the shooting sports and helping out in our respective communities.

The main issue OASR has been focusing on recently is educating ourselves on Environmental Stewardship. We have to learn how to manage our range in an environmentally sound manner. Our group is growing, and the old saying that there is strength in numbers has already proved itself in several ways.

There is much more to tell about this organization. I will be on hand at the next General Meeting to discuss OASR and answer any questions and concerns you may have.

This is a very important issue. Please plan to attend the March 8th meeting.

The opinions and ideas of our membership are a vital part of the process of protecting our range and our heritage.

I look forward to seeing you at the range.

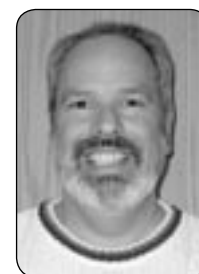
