MAIN RANGE DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE GOALS

The Main Range Development committee was set up by the club to make plans for improvement. Many ideas have been put forward in the past and the committee is pulling together all of these and more to establish short term and long range plans that can be developed from year to year as the club board changes but a consistent improvement schedule remains in place. Your committee members are: Del Martin, Mark Baur, Chuck Smith, Larry Hixon, Randy Jelen, Dick Gohl, Bruce Fried.

The committee has established the following goals to guide future development. Your input is welcome. Please use the email address to contact the committee: rangedev@arpc.info. You may also write to the club address or call Del Martin at 753-3204.

I. The primary focus of the committee will be a recommended plan for improvements to the Main Range, such as:

- Determination of the longest range target within safety constraints,
- berm/target holder layout and detail,
- Improvements around the firing line,
- Provision of sufficient novel targets to attract

shooters of all ages and abilities.

II. Long-range improvements to the entire property will be considered, to coordinate changes to the main range with future changes to other components. These may include

- Property development and/or acquisition, related legal issues
- Capacity to fire centerfire handguns indoors
- clubhouse improvements (new?)
- Provision of sufficient novel targets to attract shooters of all ages and abilities.

This is a list of shooting activities to support by the club on the main range and is by no means complete but used as a guide for planning. They include the following:

Silhouette, 22/Bigbore, Small Bore indoor & out, high power, speed steel, defensive handgun, big bore hunter, practical pistol, resettable reactive targets, full auto, load dev. tunnel w/ recovery, old west, archery, shotgun, trap, trail walk, bulls eye pistol, indoor & out airgun, benchrest, handicapped access, & black powder.

I am a court appointed Firearms Instructor and an Expert Witness on Firearms and Self-Defense. I have taught and continue to teach several thousand persons seeking a State of Oregon Concealed Handgun License. I am an advisor to "Oregon Council on Firearms Rights".
