PLEASE CHECK SATURDAY SCHEDULE!

Jimmie Johnson, Discipline Director for Benchrest, requests that members check the calendar before coming out to shoot. Many have come on Saturday lately to shoot and discover that the main range is closed because of a sanctioned match.

Until recently, some free shooting has been allowed, but with sanctioned matches it cannot be done and members have been turned away.

Please – check the calendar first to avoid disappointments.

RIMFIRE BENCHREST NEWS

Sanctioned rimfire matches will resume March, 2007. We plan to have sanctioned matches through October, but will probably have to give up one Saturday for the full auto extravaganza. Once I get those dates worked out with ARPC I will publish them.

RBA club membership is in process. I am waiting for dates from ARPC. Individual Membership forms are available from Jim Johnson. He can e-mail them to you and will have some with him during our Saturday shoots. The fee is \$15 per person. RBA rules are available on the web. The Rimfire Benchrest Association on your browser will get you there. A copy of the rules will be at each of our matches.

Matches are sanctioned by RBA for .22 rimfire only: short, long or long rifle. In sanctioned matches at ARPC we shoot unlimited class; you may shoot a lower class but will be competing with unlimited.

Benchrest shoots the fourth Saturday of each month. Rimfire registration is at 8:30, shooting begins at 9am. Centerfire shoots after rimfire at about 11:30 am. Entry fee is \$10 per rifle for rimfire.

Course of fire: Sanctioned matches shoot the standard RBA 50 yard target, 25 shots per target plus unlimited sighters. There

is one target per relay, three relays per event. 30 minutes are allowed per target.

Rifles: Rifles must be bolt action or designed as single-shot. Iron sights are permissible. A good spotting scope will be needed to see your shots. If you use a scope a 20 power is about average but many shooters are using 30 power.

All targets are shot from benchrests.

You do not need a high-priced target rifle to get started in .22 rimfire, but it must be a bolt-action rifle or single-shot. It makes more sense to me to start out with a good sporter to see if you like the sport. If you do then you can go mortgage the house for a rifle, scope and other benchrest toys.

.17 rimfire is in experimental status with the sanctioning body. While we at ARPC welcome any .17 riflemen who would like to shoot in our matches your scores cannot be counted with RBA. But you can still have a lot of fun and learn some accuracy tricks in this game.
