CONCEALED HANDGUN LICENSE CLASS AT ARPC

ARPC is pleased to announce that Jim Jacobs will be offering his Oregon Concealed Handgun License Training Class at the range.

This class is open to ARPC members and to the public, and class size is limited. Persons already possessing a CHL, but who wish to attend for the purpose of updating their knowledge will still be required to pay the class fee.

This course meets Oregon's training requirements for a Concealed Handgun License. The three-hour course consists of handgun safety, Oregon Statutes 161 & 166, threat assessment, and selection of safety equipment.

UTAH CONCEALED CARRY CLASS AT ARPC

A Non-resident Utah Concealed Firearm Permit will allow concealed carry in 30 other states, including Washington. Upon completion of this course, the permit application process can all be done by mail.

This class, taught by Jim Jacobs on Sunday, June 3rd, from 9:00 am to 1:30 pm, will meet in the North Range classroom. The fee is \$70.00. Pre-registration and pre-payment are required by June 1st.

A handgun is not required for this course. Please bring note-taking materials. There will not be a scheduled lunch break, but feel free to bring a sack lunch or snacks.

MAIN GATE CHANGES

By the time you read this article changes to the main gate should have taken place. ARPC is installing an automatic gate sensor on the exit side of the main gate. When installed you will not have to swipe your gate card to exit the main gate, just drive up to the concrete pad and the main gate will open.



In addition, we will be replacing the main gate entrance swipe pad with a combination button and swipe pad. Special one-time numbers will be issued for special events (competitions, training classes, etc.) to be used by non-members to gain entrance to the club shooting ranges.

Please have patience while construction is taking place.

MAIN RANGE TABLE TOPS

Please take a look at the two new rubber main range table tops. We would like to know what you think about these as replacements for the pieces of carpet currently in use. The carpets get very dirty and have a tendency to blow around when it gets windy on the main range.



ARPC GOLF CART

The ARPC golf cart has been moved onto the main range for members' use when posting targets at the 200-yard line. It may also be used by handicapped members when posting targets at any distance. Our goal is to decrease the amount of time needed to replace targets at the 200-yard line and increase the amount of time for shooting.



Unplug the charging cord, turn the key on and step on the "go" pedal to drive the cart downrange. Reach down beside your right leg and move the lever to reverse (you will hear the buzzer) when you want to back up. Please put the cart back into its original parking position and plug it in when you are finished using it.

GRANTS WANTED

Albany Rifle and Pistol Club has applied to the Oregon Fish and Wildlife Department for three grants. These

include requests for main range 50 yard bullet backstops, in-ground restrooms on the north range, and hunters' education tables and chairs for the north range classroom.

BENCHREST NEWS

Benchrest shoots the fourth Saturday of every month. We are shooting RBA (.22LR) three-gun combo, and unlimited. Registration begins at 8am. Match begins at 9am. All matches from March through October are RBA sanctioned and are shot at 50 yards.

Three-gun combo, sporter, 10.5lb, and unlimited shoot in that order. Unlimited finishes its last two targets when combo match is completed. Time varies so we suggest that all RBA shooters arrive at 8am.

Centerfire benchrest shoots after all classes of rimfire are finished (approximately noon). Centerfire is a club match, unsanctioned.

WANT TO TRY IT?

If you are new to rimfire benchrest and want to give it a try, here is a brief description of equipment required.

In three-gun combo you may shoot a sanctioned match with one rifle if it complies with the Sporter class. You will be competing with other sporters and the two heavier classes. You may shoot all three targets in the combo match with a heavier rifle but the score will not count for RBA or club standing.

New shooters who do not have the rifles required by the RBA rules but want to shoot an informal match in order to get a feel for the sport are welcome to shoot a combo match with just that single rifle so long as it conforms to one of the three classes below. Your scores will not count as a sanctioned match but will you get a good feel for how the matches work and the accuracy required of this sport.

If you are a new shooter please check in with the match director when you arrive. He will give you a briefing to point out safety procedures of the sport and range, get you introduced to other shooters and see to it that you have a guest name tag. Firearms must not be brought onto the range uncased if the range safety strobes and buzzers are in operation.

Target is RBA official 25 rounds, unlimited sighters. Combo three-gun shoots three targets with the unlimited target of combo counting as the first target of unlimited, which shoots two additional targets for a total of three in a separate match.

RBA shoots .22LR only. Rifles are bolt action and loaded single shot or actions such as the BSA Martini with falling or rotating blocks.

RBA three-gun combo: To fire in official matches you are required to have all three classes of rifles or one sporter class rifle.

Sporter: Under 7.5 lbs total weight and scope of no more than 6.5 power or a variable power scope with the power taped at 6.5. Rifles are loaded single shot, but are required to have a magazine. No vibration tuners, no bedding, and the stock may have not have external holes drilled in it to make weight.

10.5 lb: No more than 10.5 pounds, any power scope, stock no more than 3" in width. No electronic or mechanically assisted triggers allowed.

Unlimited: Unlimited scope power and weight. Rifle must sit entirely on bench and cannot be attached to bench.

RBA is slowly growing with new shooters at each match. We hope some of our shooters will remember their sporter class rifles and get into the combo at our next match.

Linda Johnson is our newest member and shot her first informal 3-gun match using Jim's 19 pound unlimited gun, and shot a 222. Word has it that Jim bought her a new CZ 425 sporter class and scope and she has put 1000 rounds through it in the last two weeks. At that rate of ammo consumption Jim is happy to report that the rifle absolutely will not shoot with the expensive Eley Match EPS but just loves the more plebian ammo from Wolf and GreenTag CCI.

Del's rebarreled gun got waylaid in shipping and will be delayed until just before the next match, giving very little time to get the new barrel/ammo combinations figured out. So much the better for the rest of us but I suspect we are in for trouble.

The new light box for scoring appears to have helped. Jim will have the second one finished and Wes King from the Emerald Empire club is bringing a third up for us for the next match.

New target hangers will be up for the next match and we hope David Norton will have had time to get the scoring boards finished for the match. All of this will really help speed up the scoring process.

Jim has finally got the RBA scoring software running, sort of but good enough, and scorekeeping and aggregate totals will now be done on his MacBook computer during the matches (unless someone spills their coffee on it).

If you are an old rimfire benchrest shooter who has drifted away from the sport, come on back and give it another try. The new main range is primo and there is more than a bit of competition waiting for you.

Ben Cooney from our club and Charle Hawkins from the Emerald Empire club have the beginnings of a duel going. Been shot a 687 23X to Charle's 686 17X at the March unlimited match. Paul Soward reports that his 52 has developed new life with Eley Match EPS and Del should have his rebarreled rifle here for the next match. This could get interesting.

SHOOTING TARGETS

What targets are okay to shoot at Albany Rifle and Pistol Club?



Here is a short list of what to use for targets at the various ranges:

Main Range – Targets on target boards and club steel targets.

Shotgun Range – Clay birds, targets on target boards and club steel targets.

North Range – Targets on target boards, steel targets (either the clubs or your own), clay birds and other non-breakable targets (glass, plastic, vegetable) that you bring and do not leave a mess. Barrels and Props used in shooting events are not acceptable targets. If you need a cardboard target, look in the white cabinet outside Bay 3, on the West side of the building.

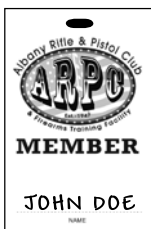

WORK BOND HOURS

Starting the 1st of April, 2007, Albany Rifle and Pistol Club will be recording all work bond hours used by members of the gun club. When you do work for Albany Rifle and Pistol Club, as a club member, record every hour you put in even if you have your required 12 hours. The club wants to recognize those folks who contribute extra hours to the club.



If you want to check out how many work bond hours you have in the system, next year, you will be able to access the computer in the main club house, enter your card number and see how many hours you have registered.

If you have time during the week and want to put in a couple of hours working at the club, just give the club office a call (541.619.0038) and let us know. We have work that needs to be done everyday of the week.

FULL BAYS ON THE NORTH RANGE

When you come out to the North Range to shoot in any of the 7 shooting bays you may find them occupied with other members. What do you do? North Range Bays are used by members just like the main range, we share space. Just because you are the first person to occupy a bay doesn't mean that you have sole possession of it.



Caution! When multiple shooters share a shooting bay you must communicate on safety issues and target setting because there is no safety alarm system in these

shooting bays. Please use common courtesy when asking to share a bay and remember the shoe might be on the other foot next time and you need to ask to share a shooting bay.

PERMANENT TRAP MACHINES

We have set up two different permanent trap machines for members use on the trap range. At anytime during non-scheduled trap events you can come out to the club and shoot trap without setting up trap machines. Each machine has a set of directions for use and specific places to stand, which directs shot down range. If you don't have clay birds with you we have boxes of 135 birds for sale in the main club house for \$8.00.
