TWO LARGE MULTI-GUN MATCHES AT ARPC

There will be two large multi-gun matches in the month of July at Albany Rifle and Pistol Club. The USPSA Area 1 (8 Northwestern States) Multi-Gun Championships will be held on June 29th, 30th and July 1st.

Multi-Gun competitions involve shooting rifle, pistol and shotgun during the same course of fire. Both matches have 10 courses of fire and each of them use a different combination of firearms to complete the course of fire.

Members should be aware to watch the club calendar for range

closure dates surrounding both of these matches. Both events will try to work around members' use but during the competitions parts of the ranges will be closed.

OREGON DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND WILDLIFE GRANTS

Albany Rifle and Pistol Club has been notified that we have received funding for all of the ODFW grants for which we applied. We will begin construction this summer, so watch the schedules, on the 50 yard line (main range) and the in-ground rest room facilities (north range).

EASTSIDE CHANGES - LONGER RIFLE SHOOTING?

Changes to Albany Rifle and Pistol Club on the east side of Saddle Butte will be taking place when we have permission from Linn County. In July we will submit a request to change our conditional use permit.

The two areas we will be working on will include opening five new shooting bays and preparing the 350 yard range. The five new shooting bays are already built, but we will need to wait until the summer of 2008 before potential work on the 350 yard range can begin.

DAMAGED TARGETS

Last month we showed you a picture of a damaged steel target shot by a member or visitor with some type of firearm that left big dents. This month we are adding to our picture series of damaged targets by showing you two additional photos of targets damaged this month.



The ARPC Executive Board has discussed this problem and does not have any definite answers about a solution. The plate rack in the picture is the one located on the south end of the main range. Sometime during Thursday or Friday, June 7th or 8th this plate rack was shot by a small caliber high velocity firearm.



The second picture involves a discipline setting up this target backwards, shooting it, damaging it and then putting it away without saying a word about repairing it.

This damage has cost the club \$600-\$800 over the last two months. What do we do to stop this abuse of club property? Do we put the targets away and only use them for special events? Do we put up cameras so we can record what members do on the ranges?

RACING A FIREARM

I'll bet you have never thought about recreational shooting this way. Yes, we race handguns, rifles and shotguns at ARPC. Check out Old West, Speed Steel, USPSA Pistol shooting or Multi-Gun if you want to see how they do it.

WOULD YOU LIKE TO BUY AN M1?

One of the benefits of belonging to the Albany Rifle and Pistol Club is the opportunity to purchase rifles, ammunition, parts, equipment, targets and books from the Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP). Albany Rifle and Pistol Club is an affiliated club with CMP and you, as a member of this club, can purchase items directly from CMP.

BENCHREST NEWS

Benchrest matches are held on the fourth Saturday of each month: rimfire, .22 LR, sanctioned by RBA: 3-gun combo and unlimited class. Centerfire shoots informal matches when rimfire is finished, approximately 12pm. Registration at 8am. Matches begin at 9am.

To shoot you need at least one rifle that meets the sporter class requirements: maximum of 7.5 pounds, scope of 6 power or less, mechanical trigger only, magazine but capable of being loaded single shot. With that rifle you can shoot all classes but will be competing against all classes.

At the beginning improvement comes quickly, and each additional dollar spent on better rifles, triggers, and accessories brings considerable improvement in average scores. For the top-flight shooters each tiny increment of improvement represents large investments of mental concentration, practice time, fine tuning of equipment, and expense.

But you, and only you, pick the level at which you are satisfied. You shoot as an individual, not a team member who must constantly improve to support the team.

APRIL 28TH MATCH

As always, our main range had something to teach everyone about wind. Today's lesson was "light isn't necessarily, and only rarely, good." And the moral of that lesson is, "when the wind is soft one

had best keep a very keen eye on the flags at all times'. **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S ARTICLE**

Please have patience with me as I'm going to step out of my roll as Executive Director of Albany Rifle and Pistol Club and step into the roll as an appreciative American.



While we fight many battles within daily life to keep Second Amendment rights alive and put food on the table for our families, young men and women in the military are fighting for our freedom. Whether you agree or disagree with the battles that are taking place in Iraq and Afghanistan, our troops are doing the job that they signed up to do without complaining or blaming either side. If battles have to be fought then I would rather see them take place off our shores and away from our homeland.

I appreciate everything that these troops do and I want to give something back to them. This is not an ARPC initiative, but as a father and as an American I'm asking for your help.

Nearly two years ago, John Baker of Salem, Oregon, started a program called Operation Love Boxes. Operation Love Boxes is a state-wide program that sends a UPS 0-FRB1 priority mail flat rate box within 10-14 days to our troops overseas for a flat rate of \$8.10. This box can be picked up for free from any U.S. Post Office and can be packed with candy, CDs, books, foam footballs or just about anything you think the troops would want.

To date, Operation Love Box has sent more than 12,000 boxes to our troops anonymously. I'm asking you to send a box to our troops or get a group together and do a packing party to send a number of boxes. All the information about this project is available at www.loveboxesforourtroops.com. In addition to shipping instructions, this website includes some of the letters of thanks from the troops who have already received boxes. A gift so simple makes a big impact on a person. I know because my son received more than one when he was over there.

This is another way Albany Rifle and Pistol Club can make an impact on our world. When you open up your heart and give freely to our troops you never know what kind of impact it may make. Last year we sent full boxes of hard candy left over from Halloween, and I heard that many of our troops shared it with Iraq's children. Those boxes gave a little joy to children in a country with many hardships and hopefully made their day a little better.

I will have extra boxes, mailing forms and instructions available at the main range clubhouse if you want to stop by and pick them up, at no charge to the club or you. Thank you for taking the time to listen to my heart.

**HUNTERS' SIGHT-IN DAYS**

How many hunters have missed elk, like the one mounted in our clubhouse, or deer, because their rifle was not sighted in properly? Or worse yet, how many animals suffered from a poor shot that didn't kill them swiftly?



Albany Rifle and Pistol Club is expanding our "Hunters' Sight-In Days" this year to three weekends; September 8th-9th, 15th-16th, and 22nd- 23rd to help sight in more hunters. We will be expanding the advertising and reaching out to hunters with the message about making sure their rifles are sighted in correctly and ready to go for

hunting season.

With this expanded effort we will need your help to make sure we can handle the expected increase in sight-ins. Please call the club office 541-619-0038 and get your name on the help list for this event, even if you can work only one day or one weekend. As we get closer to the actual dates we will have more information about the schedule and don't tell anyone but we might even have a running buck target this year.

**GUEST BADGES & MEMBERSHIP STICKERS**

If your membership sticker has worn out and you would like a new one, there are extra stickers in the red box just inside the back door of the main clubhouse. We didn't send out new stickers this year because they were not dated with the club year and looked exactly like last year's sticker. However, some of your membership badge stickers look pretty shabby and if you want a new one, they are available at no charge.



In addition to membership stickers, the red box contains a roll of visitor badges. Please remember to fill out a visitor badge for each of your guests when they are on any range at the club.

## CONCEALED HANDGUN LICENSE TRAINING

ARPC is pleased to announce that Jim Jacobs will be offering his "Oregon Concealed Handgun License Training" class at the range. This class will be held the third Tuesday of every month at ARPC on May 15, June 19, July 17, etc. Subsequent class dates will be listed on the Club calendar. The fee is \$50.00.

This class is open to ARPC members and to the public, and class size is limited. Persons already possessing a CHL, but who wish to attend for the purpose of updating their knowledge will still be required to pay the class fee. Class will meet in the North Range classroom from 6:30 to 9:30 pm. Please arrive by 6:15 to complete your registration paperwork. Pre-registration and pre-payment are required; registration will close on the Friday before each class.

This course meets Oregon's training requirements for a Concealed Handgun License. This 3-hour course consists of handgun safety, Oregon Statutes 161 & 166, threat assessment and selection of safety equipment. A handgun is not required for this course. Please bring note taking materials.

## SHOTGUN NEWS

Greetings fellow members/shooters. We have had a great month with lots going on and getting done over here behind the gray wall. We did have the Shoot for the Troops trap shoot and managed to raise \$240.00 for our effort. I am somewhat dismayed we did not have any support from many of our club members. Oh well, that is OK.



We will start up a five stand on the first Tuesday night of July. For those of you from Rio Linda, that is next month. The cost for the shoot will be \$3.00 for members and \$3.50 for non members. This is just to start out. If we need to, we will take a second look at it.

The time to start will be 3:00pm on the 3rd of July.

The next thing on my agenda is to address non-members at the trap range. After some consulting with the e-board, our members that shoot, and some that don't shoot trap, we will now add a surcharge of 50 cents to every shoot. The cost is still the lowest in the valley. I hope to not have to up the price of shooting at our trap range.

We also changed the time we start to 5:00 pm. The reason for that start is to make it more convenient to the members who get off of work late in the day. I hope that time works out for the club. With the new lights we have up, darkness will have no effect on our shooting. I sort of hope it will have a positive effect on our being able to see the birds.

I now have two old trap machines set up, so if you want to shoot straight trap, you can. If games are going on, we will shoot the games from the old Western thrower while straight trap is going on. All we will have to do is be careful.

This last week the folks from Hevi Shot came down with some ounce and a quarter of shot loaded up to 1500 fps. Talk about a thumper! Whoa dog! The company not only discovered what the shot will do to a shotgun barrel, but they made a whole bunch of their employees into flinchers too. That 870 express barrel turned brown from the heat. Yes sir, I was impressed with their product and will use it too. I also helped out the Albany Police department by taking one of our battery operated traps out to let them shoot birds. This was done so they would have a quality bird thrown, but also thrown safely. I did note there were some I would like to see come on out to shoot with some of the gunslingers at the trap range. Some did start out poor but were breaking birds real soon. Bottom line was they had a safe shoot while qualifying to go out to protect your community. (I had fun giving them a bad time)

Last month I spoke of using permatex for lubing your chokes, One more will work too. The same grease you sue to lube your doors on your cars will work too. It is called lithium grease. You can buy a big tube of the stuff for a lot less than what a small tube of the gun lube costs. It is easier to clean up too. You can use it on the actions of your over under or side by side shotguns.

One last thing: we will sponsor a cookout in the parking lot in front of the north rifle range on work bond Saturday in July and August. Come one and come all. Do not think it is only for the shotgun shooters because it isn't. Come on over and eat and talk guns bullets and powder and shoot the bull too. See you all at the range and shoot lots of bullets.
