GLOCK SPORT SHOOTING FOUNDATION MATCH

Albany Rifle and Pistol Club will hold one of the national Glock Sport Shooting Foundation (GSSF) matches on Saturday, August 4th, and Sunday, August 5th. GSSF supports Glock shooting by holding these matches in every state of the Union throughout the year. Club members and the public shoot three courses of fire in different divisions as many times as they want in this competition. It costs \$25 each time they shoot the three stages. All shooting takes place from the low ready position; there is no movement and no speed reloading. To look at the stages and how it works go to www.gssfonline.com.



This competition should draw between 300 and 500 people from all over the Northwest and we need your help. We need at least 20 people to be range officers for the match. You do not need to be an ARPC range officer to be a range officer in the match. For every four hours you work as a range officer you will be given a ticket for a chance to win a free Glock pistol and we are giving two away to the ROs. In addition, you can shoot the stages free if you own a Glock. The more tickets you get the better the odds are that you will win a Glock. We will provide all the training you need to work the match and your work bond hours will count.

It is very hard to recruit one of these matches and we feel very proud of the fact that we can put on one of the two matches to be held in Oregon. If you don't want to compete in the match but you own a Glock, bring it out to the range. The Glock armorer will take it apart and replace any worn parts free of charge.

EYES AND EARS

"Eyes and Ears" (eye and ear protection) are required on all shooting ranges at Albany Rifle and Pistol Club at all times. This is a club policy for your own safety and there is no room for discussion. Bullet fragments can hit the body in many places but a hit to the eye normally cannot be repaired. We don't take chances with safety.

RANGE CONSTRUCTION

Please watch the live newsletter calendar or give the office a call (541-619-0038) before coming out to the club in August. We will be installing the 50 yard target backstops in the month of August and do not have a specific date for this work. Part of the building materials are not available at this time and the work schedule depends on when they can be delivered to the club. Construction will take about five mornings to complete and we will not work on it during the weekends. We will also post signs a week ahead of time to give as much advance notice as possible prior to starting the work.

GUEST BADGES & MEMBERSHIP STICKERS

If your membership sticker has worn out and you would like a new one, there are extra stickers in the red box just inside the back door of the main clubhouse. THE AMERICAN SPORTSMAN FACTS

Here are some interesting facts forwarded to us by the Oregon State Shooting Association. There are 248,000 hunters and 687,000 anglers licensed in the State of Oregon who annually pay \$64.2 million dollars in state fuel and income taxes. Sportsmen support more jobs in Oregon than Intel, Nike and Oregon State University, three of the state's largest employers, combined (21,055 jobs vs. 15,700). The ripple effect on the state economy is \$2.18 billion dollars.

Nearly as many people hunt and fish in Oregon as attend Portland Trailblazers games (761,000 vs. 831,000). Oregon sportsmen outnumber the combined populations of Portland, Eugene and Medford (761,000 vs. 730,168). "We should be able to dictate the vote on almost any topic with that kind of voting power." (ARPC comment). Oregon sportsmen annually spend nearly sixteen times the revenues from the state's commercial seafood landings and equal 43% of the Gross State Product from lumber and wood. OREGON ASSOCIATION OF SHOOTING RANGES

INTRODUCTION TO PISTOL CLASS

It may help you make better shots at those birds you often miss. For those of you who do not like to shoot trap or shoot the games we play at trap, come on over. This is an entirely new and different game.

Five Stand is open at 3:p.m. every Tuesday. Right now the cost is \$3.00 per round of 25 of the toughest birds you will shoot. It is \$3.50 for visitors. Once we get a better handle on the cost, we may have to bump the price a bit. Right now it looks like we are in the ball park. We will just have to wait a bit to be sure.

I donated a carport type tent to the club. We put it up so the shooters at the north rifle range and the shotgun shooter could have some shade and get out of the summer showers. I also moved the picnic table from the trap area to the tent. The first use came at the end of work bond when we had a cookout. My wife made the potato salad, and the baked beans. Patrick cooked the hot dogs and hamburgers. The meal was for everyone not just the shotgunners. A few folks did drop by and enjoyed the food. Heck it was free and I can not imagine any one turning down a free meal.
