NEW GATE ENTRY SYSTEM

Unknowing visitors do not know ARPC range rules and have the potential to get into dangerous safety situations on the range. Visitors are welcome at ARPC but they must be accompanied by a member at all times when on the property.



THEFT ON THE NORTH RANGE



The correct answer is the elephant because you left it in the refrigerator. This tests your memory. Okay, even if you did not answer the first three questions correctly you still have one more chance to show your true abilities.

2nd-3rd. GSSF supports Glock shooting by holding these matches in every state of the union throughout the year. Club members and the public shoot three courses of fire in different divisions as many times as they want n this competition. It costs \$25 each time they shoot these three stages. All shooting takes place from the low ready position. There is no movement and no speed reloading. To look at the stages and how it works go to www.gssfonline.com.

This competition should draw between 300 and 500 people from all over the Northwest and we need your help. We need at least 20 people to be range officers for the match. You do not need to be an ARPC range officer to be a range officer in the match. For every four hours you work as a range officer you will be given a ticket to win a free Glock pistol and we are giving away a Glock to one of the range officers.. In addition, you can shoot the stages free if you own a Glock. For every four hours you work you get a ticket. The more tickets you get the better the odds are that you will win a Glock. We will provide all the training you need to work the match and your work bond hours will count.

It is very hard to recruit one of these matches and we feel very proud of the fact that we can put on one of the two matches to be held in Oregon. If you don't want to compete in the match and own a Glock, bring it out to the range. The Glock armorer will take it apart and replace any worn parts free of charge.

If you like to shoot then belonging to ARPC is a great value. Recently we have seen fuel prices and the cost of ammunition or reloading components take dramatic increases. There is no doubt that it costs you more to shoot nowadays than it did six months or a year ago. How can



we continue to recreationally shoot and enjoy the smell of gun smoke?

We have made sure there are brooms, dust little longer by shooting more than one or two pans, burn barrels and new garbage cans in firearms. Bring everything you need with you to the range and make the trip a more enjoyable stay. Second, invite a friend and share the costs to the range by splitting the gas or taking turns driving to the range. Besides, bragging rights are more fun when friends shoot together. Third, think about reloading your ammunition and buying reloading components from the ARPC store. Reloading your own bullets can save you anywhere from 25% to 50%. Fourth, plan a shooting trip to the range on work bond Saturday and save money on your membership renewal, then shoot at noon when work bond work is finished.

> Almost every day I receive phone calls from people looking for a place to shoot because the woods have been shut down, or, if they have a spot to shoot it takes a half of tank of gas to get to it. When you do the math, an individual membership, where a member puts in 12 hours of work for the club, costs only \$5 per month. Even if they don't put in any work bond time the monthly cost is only a little over \$11 per month. Compare that to belonging to a golf club or the membership at an athletic club. Your membership at ARPC is one of the best values for your recreational dollars so take the time to stay longer and have fun.
