### SUMMER TIME CONSTRUCTION

We have finished installing the 50 yard sand bullet traps on the main range, created a new entrance to the main range and sealed off the berm between the shotgun range and main range. In addition, the road has been finished that provides access to the 4 acres on the northeast corner of the club property. It is now possible to drive your pickup to this area if you have firewood cut and ready to haul. The summer time is the best time to finish work projects at the club and we will try to keep closures to a minimum because it is also one of the best times to shoot.

### SHOOT STRAIGHT



The new 50 yard sand bullet traps have been installed on the main range. All shooting positions on the main range have a number and this number corresponds to a numbered target board downrange. As an example; if you use shooting bench "1" and shoot at target boards marked "1" at the 50 yard, 100 yard and 200 yard line you will be shooting straight downrange and not diagonally across the range. In addition, this will make sure that bullets enter the sand traps at the 50 yard line correctly.

Always remember "Make sure of what is behind your target when shooting". We want to contain and recycle as much bullet lead as possible from all of our ranges thus it is important to make sure that most bullets enter the bullet traps when possible.

### IF YOU BRING IT - TAKE IT HOME

This article speaks mainly to those members and guests that use the North Range bays, but it applies to all members who shoot on all ranges. If you bring targets or props to shoot please take them home with you after you are done. We are generating a large quantity of trash left behind by members and shooting disciplines. There are no employees at ARPC; volunteers clean up the bays

on work bond Saturday. This can leave 30 days or more in between cleanup days. The best rule of thumb to use when shooting at ARPC is: "leave it better than when you found it".

We have made sure there are brooms, dust pans, burn barrels and new garbage cans in each bay building. The garbage cans and burn barrels are not target holders or targets. The burn barrels are unusable due to fire restrictions in the summer so please take your used targets home with you.

The BLUE plastic buckets are to be used for empty brass and the RED plastic buckets are for dud or unfired rounds only. These buckets are not garbage cans. If you use Blazer ammunition or steel-cased bullets please throw the empty rounds away. Don't throw live rounds in the garbage or burn barrels.

Again, "leave it better than when you found it."

## GLOCK SPORT SHOOTING FOUNDATION MATCH

Albany Rifle and Pistol Club will hold one of the national Glock Sport Shooting Foundation (GSSF) matches on Saturday and Sunday, August 2nd-3rd. GSSF supports Glock shooting by holding these matches in every state of the union throughout the year. Club members and the public shoot three courses of fire in different divisions as many times as they want in this competition. It costs \$25 each time they shoot these three stages. All shooting takes place from the low ready position. There is no movement and no speed reloading. To look at the stages and how it works go to [www.gssfonline.com](http://www.gssfonline.com).



This competition should draw between 300 and 500 people from all over the Northwest and we need your help. We need at least 20 people to be range officers for the match. You do not need to be an ARPC range officer to be a range officer in the match. For every four hours you work as a range officer you will be given a ticket to win a free Glock pistol and we are giving away a Glock to one of the range officers. In addition, you can shoot the stages free if you own a Glock. For every four hours you work you get a ticket. The more tickets you get the better the odds are that you will win a Glock. We will provide all the training you need to work the match and your work bond hours will count.

It is very hard to recruit one of these matches and we feel very proud of the fact that we can put on one of the two matches to be held in Oregon. If you don't want to compete in the match and own a Glock, bring it out to the range. The Glock armorer will take it apart and replace any worn parts free of charge.

Please give the club office a call (541-619-0038) if you want to be part of a special match and have a chance to win a Glock pistol.

## THEFT ON THE NORTH RANGE

On Thursday, June 12th, someone removed a steel target and stand from Bay 6 on the North Range. This target was set up for a junior USPSA practice and qualification session along with two other steel targets. Over the years we have lost several steel targets or stands and just replaced them with your club funds. However, this is taking something away from the junior shooting program and stealing your club property. We want to give the benefit of the doubt that it was removed from the bay by mistake and will be returned soon.



Stealing club property can result in the loss of your club membership. Since the gate system records everyone who entered the club we will be contacting all club members who used the range that day. If this member thinks

they can use this target for their own personal target on ARPC property in the future, think again. Take a look at the picture and give the club office a call if you see it. All eyes will be watching for this target.

## NEW GATE ENTRY SYSTEM

The front main gate scanning pad has been replaced with a combination scan pad and button system. It still works the same as the old scanning pad and your gate cards will open the gate. Beginning in July, all extra gates will stay closed for special events and discipline shoots. The purpose behind this system is to limit the number of visitors who drive through the open gates during events. Unknowing visitors do not know ARPC range rules and have the potential to get into dangerous safety situations on the range. Visitors are welcome at ARPC but they must be accompanied by a member at all times when on the property.



Each event or discipline shoot will have a number assigned to it and given to all participants. When they drive up to the main front gate they enter the number followed by the # key and the gate will open. Each number only lasts for that day and will not work at any other time. Contact your event director if you are scheduled to shoot in an upcoming event or discipline shoot and they will give you the number to use on the gate system. Call the ARPC office if you have any problems with the front main gate system.

## GATE CARDS TURNED OFF

Gate cards have been turned off on all members who have not renewed their 2008 club membership. Should you run into a situation where your gate card does not work just give the club office a call at 541-619-0038. Please accept our apologies in advance if we have turned off your gate card by mistake or not recorded your membership renewal.

Renewal notices were included in the January and February newsletters and most members have renewed for 2008. If you are one of those members who didn't renew, please call Bob Hamilton, club treasurer, Art Carmean, membership director, or the club office. 2007 members can renew their membership by paying the full amount owed for 2008.

## ARPC PRO SHOP

Albany Rifle and Pistol Club has starting putting together a small pro shop to sell reloading components and reloaded ammunition to club members at a discounted price. It is not the club's intention to compete with our business partners who promote our club to their customers. Our goal is to offer a few items like bulk bullets for reloading, primers, brass and reloaded ammunition to club members as another benefit of belonging to ARPC. Please look at the flyers posted in the main range club house and on the club website for items and prices.

The pro shop is not open on a regular basis due to the fact that we do not have any employees who can keep the shop open during set hours. Most of the time the pro shop is open when the club office is open but always call ahead to make sure.

## CLUB BULLETIN BOARDS

The ARPC bullet boards are used to inform club members of special important information related to the club or club areas where they are shooting. These boards are not used for commercial use other than ARPC information. The



main bulletin board in the main clubhouse can be used by members to post firearm related sales/needs. All information posted on this bulletin board must use 5 x 8" cards and will be kept on the board for at least one full calendar month before being removed. 5 x 8" cards are available at the club house for this purpose.

Do not post editorials, letters, comments or commercial ads on this bulletin board because they will be removed. ARPC does not recommend, stand behind or have anything to do with ads selling or purchasing firearm related merchandise posted on the main range bulletin board other than 'Pro Shop' items. In addition, ARPC recommends that all appropriate firearm laws be followed when buying and selling regulated items.

## WORK BOND

Members who work for the club are entitled to have those hours posted to their WORK BOND account. Sometimes this is hard to do as the forms are not filled out properly, with a beginning time and no ending time and often no total of hours.

Please fill out the form completely. Print your name, date and time in and time out plus total hours worked. Save the yellow copy for your records; sometimes things get lost on misplaced. Program Directors have forms on hand so your people can get credit of their hours worked.

Never tell any one that they don't have to fill out a form. Please get work bond forms turned in the same month that the work is done. I received forms from work done in August, 2007, in March of this year.

If everyone does their part, our records will be up to date and you will know how many hours you have every month.

I want to remind everyone that there is a range seldom used on our property: a fifty and 100 yard range to the north of the gray wall with benches and chairs. Do not be afraid to use them as long as there is nothing going on over there. If there is, check with the match director at the shotgun range and see what you can do.



We are still working on getting the gong back up so it won't be something we have to work on every month. I am hoping to have the main road graveled after it gets aligned with the target boards. We shouldn't have to romp and stomp through the mud this winter or next spring.

I am asking and reminding shooters to NOT shoot at the big old rocks on the main range. I know some of the rocks are sandstone but most are not. ## EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS REPORT

How many of you have heard the phrase "gravel pit mentality?" This phrase describes the attitude of shooters who use gravel pits for their shooting pleasure while destroying property, leaving garbage and creating dangerous situations. Most of the gravel pit shooting sites have been closed down over the last few years because of these problems and many of those folks who used to shoot at these sites have joined ARPC. I'm not saying that all people who used to use gravel pits for shooting ranges created the problem but because of the few who did everyone ended up with the blame.



So how do we keep our club from becoming a "gravel pit" shooting site? Over the past few months I've seen a few situations where we might be heading that way and this bothers me.

The biggest problem is garbage on the north range. If you bring something out to use as a target then take it home don't leave it at the club. This goes for cardboard, wood boards, metal frames and other targets. Don't leave it in the bays thinking that someone else wants to shoot it or someone else will clean it up. None of us wants to have someone looking over our shoulder while we are shooting to make sure we are not creating a mess. If you bring it to the range take it home when you are done and always leave the range in better shape than when you found it.

Here are a few other areas where we can keep ARPC looking good: return sand bags and bench rest boxes to the rack that holds them on the main range, clean up spent rounds on all ranges when done shooting, remove used targets from target boards and pick up trash whenever you see it on the range. We have one of the finest shooting ranges in the northwest, with all of your help we can keep it looking good.

## VOTE

Every election that gives a citizen the chance to vote on a particular issue or candidate is important and is our right as a free citizen. This year we have a very special election coming up that will elect the next President to the United States. I would urge you, members of ARPC, to take a very close look at the two candidates who want your vote for this office. While you may not be happy with either candidate who is running for this office there is a great difference between them and your 2nd Amendment rights are on the line, not to mention many other issues.

Just recently the Supreme Court of the United States delivered a ruling on the firearm restrictions in the District of Columbia. The vote was 5 to 4 in favor of striking down the current firearm ban in the District of Columbia and supporting the 2nd Amendment. This vote was too close and it is possible that the next President of the United States will pick at least one and maybe more than one supreme court justice to replace those who retire. While there are checks and balances through the multi party system in the House of Representatives and Senate that is not the case with the Supreme Court. Our nation has one of the best balanced forms of government in the history of the world, however our court systems have moved more to making policy than interpreting the law lately.

If you value your freedom to keep and use firearms than you better look at the candidates who are running for every office all the way up to the President of United States. Don't boycott your vote because they aren't your favorite candidate but take a hard look at those who are running for the position and vote. We can talk about the "Left" and the "Right" in politics but it is not necessary because if you support those who recognize your 2nd Amendment rights then you are voting for a person who believes in the whole U.S. Constitution.

Here is a question for you, why is the right to bear arms listed as the 2nd Amendment to the Constitution right after freedom of speech? It must have been important to those who crafted the U.S. Constitution to put it close to the top of the list. Don't just stop with your vote but talk to others and get them to vote too!

- "Glock Sport Shooting Foundation" Oregon Regional Match, August 2nd and 3rd, north range bays 1 thru 7. It consists of 3 different courses of fire where the competitor starts from the low ready position and hits designated targets as fast as possible. Competitors stand in one position, do not draw from the holster and are not required to reload during the course of fire.

The event is open to all Glock pistol owners and the courses of fire may be shot more than once but require additional fees. There are many different divisions and awards include pistols, cash and other prizes. In addition, GSSF brings in a Glock armor that works on Glock pistols, cleans and inspects them at no charge. - 2008 SASS Oregon State Championship, August 13th through the 17th. This match is the Oregon State Old West Shooting Championships and includes shooting competitions, old west village, authentic clothing and cooking. It is open to all old west shooters and visitors.
