
NRA BASIC PISTOL CLASS

It covers the safe handling and fundamentals of shooting handguns as well as safe storage and how to choose a handgun. These topics are covered first in the classroom with lessons, demonstrations, and practical exercises, then you will have the opportunity to practice them hands-on during live-fire on the range with one-on-one help from our staff. This class fulfills the training requirements for the Oregon Concealed Handgun License.

If you own or have access to a handgun, bring it, unloaded, to class along with 50 rounds of ammunition. If you will not be bringing your own firearm, please arrange for rental when you register. Also bring eye and ear protection if you have it. Bring a lunch. Pre-registration is required. Contact Mark Baur to register or for more information. The fee for this class is \$35. Classes are held on Saturdays, beginning at 8:30 a.m. at ARPC on January 3, February 7, April 4, May 2, July 4, August 1, October 3, and November 7.

BACKGROUND CHECKS ON GUN SALES MOST EVER IN NOVEMBER

Background checks on the sale of firearms reached record levels during the month of November, pointing to a spike in sales for the month. Data from the FBI's National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS) show a 42 percent increase in November firearm purchaser



background checks. A total of 1,529,635 checks -- the highest monthly total ever -- were reported for the month, up from 1,079,923 in November 2007. Federal law requires FBI background checks on individuals purchasing firearms from federally licensed retailers. The NICS increase coincides with an increase in federal excise taxes reported by firearms and ammunition manufacturers, another key economic indicator for the firearms industry. Trends such as excise taxes and NICS data are strong indicators of sales patterns; however, they are not actual sales. There is no data source that captures firearms sales by month.

INTERIOR ANNOUNCES FINAL FIREARMS POLICY UPDATE

WASHINGTON, D.C. - Assistant Secretary of the Interior for Fish and Wildlife and Parks Lyle Layerty announces that the Department of the Interior has finalized updated regulations governing the



possession of firearms in national parks and wildlife refuges. The final rule, which updates existing regulations, would allow an individual to carry a concealed weapon in national parks and wildlife refuges if, and only if, the individual is authorized to carry a concealed weapon under state law in the state in which the national park or refuge is located. The update has been submitted to the Federal Register for publication and is available to the public on www.doi.gov.

Utah Concealed Handgun License is recognized in 32 states including Washington and Idaho but not Oregon. Newsletter Editor: Newsletter articles and member classified ads


Website Administrator: Questions about the website make-up and note; he cannot make changes to the website without the President or Executive Director's approval.

Please remember that contact information for these positions are listed in the newsletter and website. Many of the people who fill these positions have full time jobs and cannot always answer you right away so have patience.


EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S COLUMN
