BOONE & CROCKETT CLUB CONFIRMS NEW WORLD'S RECORD ELK



MISSOULA, Montana - Perhaps the largest elk ever produced in the wild - a Utah bull taken in 2008 by a hunter on public land - has been confirmed as a new world's record.

A special judge's panel determined a final score of 478-5/8 B&C non-typical points, an incredible 93-plus inches above the Boone and Crockett minimum score of 385 for non-typical American elk, and more than 13 inches larger than the previous world's record.

It is the only elk on record with a gross score approaching the 500-inch mark, at 499-3/8. Official data dates back to 1830.

The giant bull has nine points on the left antler and 14 points on the right. The larger antler has a base circumference topping nine inches.

The Boone and Crockett scoring system, long used to measure the success of wildlife conservation and management programs across North America, rewards antler size and symmetry, but also recognizes nature's imperfections with non-typical categories for most antlered game. The bull's final score of 478-5/8 inches includes an amazing 140 inches of abnormal points.

The hunter, Denny Austad of Ammon, Idaho, hunted the Monroe Mountain District in south-central Utah. Hunting with a self-designed rifle, Austad killed the bull on Sept. 30, 2008. He hunted for 13 days before connecting with the trophy, dubbed "spider bull" for its unique antler configuration. (The Outdoor Wire 1/6/09)

RIGHT TO CARRY IN NATIONAL PARKS, BLM LANDS, FOREST SERVICE LANDS, AND WILDLIFE REFUGES

In early December, the U.S. Department of the Interior (DOI), through the National Park Service and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, announced the final amended version of a change to rules on carrying firearms in national parks and wildlife refuges. The change will restore the right of law-abiding gun owners to transport and carry concealed firearms for lawful purposes on most DOI lands, according to the laws of the states in which these public lands are located.



The new rule, which takes effect today, allows right-to-carry permit holders to carry concealed firearms in national parks and wildlife refuges in states that recognize their permits. The new rule will also put an end to the patchwork of regulations that governed different lands managed by different federal agencies. In the past, Bureau of Land Management and Forest Service lands allowed the carrying of firearms, while lands managed by DOI did not. (NRA-ILA Alert 1/10/09)

WILD BOAR HUNTED IN GERMANY'S CAPITAL CITY

City-appointed hunters have shot more than 500 wild boar in areas of Berlin, Germany, since April, but authorities estimate up to 7,000 of the

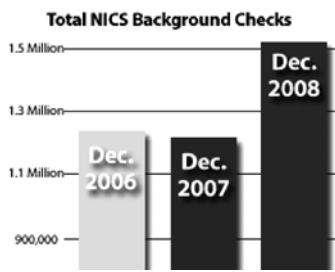

GUN SALES CONTINUE UPWARD IN DECEMBER

Despite a weak economy and slumping retail sales, gun sales continued to increase in December amid concerns that incoming lawmakers will institute a new gun ban on law-abiding Americans. Data from the FBI's National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS) show background checks on the sale of firearms jumped 24 percent in December when compared to December 2007. The increase follows a 42 percent rise in NICS checks for November. FBI background checks are required under federal law for all individuals purchasing firearms from federally licensed retailers. These checks serve as a strong indicator of actual sales. The increase has been attributed to concerns about the change in leadership in Washington. A recent poll by Southwick Associates, Inc., showed that 80 percent of hunters and shooters say they expect it will become more difficult to purchase firearms under the incoming administration and Congress. Final year-end NICS data revealed a total of 12,709,023 background checks reported in 2008, up 14 percent from 2007. (NSSF Bullet Points 1/12/09)

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S COLUMN

GUN BANS AND AMMUNITION RESTRICTIONS: Over the last three or four months I have had quite a few people ask me what I think is going to happen with firearms, ammunition and concealed carry under the new administration in Washington, D.C.. No one has a crystal ball that will look into the future; however, by looking at all the press and past voting records of those taking office, it looks like we are going to be in for a real battle around gun issues.



Albany Rifle and Pistol Club receives a large amount of information from NRA, NSSF, other firearm related associations and our members about potential problem issues concerning these topics. Some of it is factual and some of it is close to factual or at one time was based on facts. Naturally we are a lightning rod for any issues surrounding guns, but what do we do with the information and how much of it do we relay to you, our members?

First, if you hear something about gun bans, ammunition restrictions, concealed carry issues or any other issue that flies in the face of our second amendment freedoms try to check out the source and make sure what you read or hear is factual. As an example, just recently I heard about an issue surrounding bullet identification numbers and what it would mean to us if legislative bills were passed enforcing this issue. As I started researching this topic I found there is some movement in favor of having a number attached to each bullet for tracking purposes, and it would supposedly cost us tax of five cents a round tax to pay for administering this law. Yes, there is draft legislation on the internet, but from no specific state, and the real cost is 1/2 cent a round. Personally I believe some group is floating a trial balloon to see if there is any support for the idea.

If you are concerned about what might happen in the future concerning anything related to firearms then stay alert, try to make sure of the facts, let the ARPC President know about these issues and be ready to contact your local, state or federal representatives should it be necessary. We don't want to call "wolf" unless there is real danger and that requires action. An assistant to U.S. Representative Darlene Hooley told me a couple of years ago "all it takes is six or more letters about a particular topic to get Darlene involved in an issue".

We can't be sure all our representatives respond this easily but if they see a problem heading their way then they will act. Member 13993.

Last but not least, stay tuned to the Saddle Butte Press and get signed up on the ARPC email network. If there is an important issue that needs public input then we need to be ready to act.
