RANGE RULE CHANGE



It is no longer permissible to use hand thrown clay bird throwers on the trap range. The only trap throwers that can be used on the trap range are the electrically-powered machines provided by the club. The rule has been changed to insure that shotgun shot falls down range and not over the main range or north road berm. Give the club office a call if you have any questions about this rule change or how you can shoot trap at the club.

JUDGE ENJOINS RIGHT TO CARRY IN NATIONAL PARKS



Due to a federal judge's ruling, there is now a court injunction in place that puts this ruling on hold until the courts decide the validity of the rule. What this means to you is that if you carry concealed in National Parks, you will be breaking the law even if you have a concealed handgun license. Please let your U.S. Representative and Senators know how you feel about this injunction. Here is the original press release from NRA-ILA:

In early December, the U.S. Department of the Interior (DOI), through the National Park Service and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, announced the final amended version of a change to rules on carrying firearms in national parks and wildlife refuges. The change will restore the right of law-abiding gun owners to transport and carry concealed firearms for lawful purposes on most DOI lands, according to the laws of the states in which these public lands are located.

The new rule, which takes effect today, allows Right-to-Carry permit holders to carry concealed firearms in national parks and wildlife refuges in states that recognize their permits. The new rule will also put an end to the patchwork of regulations that governed different lands managed by different federal agencies.

April 1st is the renewal date for all individual and family memberships. CLEAN UP YOUR RANGE



During new member orientation we tell every new member that they "should always leave the range in better shape than [they] found it". What does that mean? If you are shooting on the main range, remove your targets when you are done, sweep up around your shooting bench, put the rifle/pistol rests back where they belong, put the sand bags back where they belong and place shooting seats back under the shelf at the rear of the range.

If you are shooting on the north rifle range or shotgun range, remove targets from target boards and pick up all brass or shotgun shells when you are finished shooting. If you are shooting on the north range remove all targets, take home everything you brought to the range and sweep up the bay area that you are shooting in. Included in this article is a picture of trash left in one of the shooting bays. IF YOU BRING IT TO THE RANGE TAKE IT HOME WITH YOU!

Keeping the range clean is the responsibility of all members and their guests. When using the club, don't leave it up to work bond workers to clean up your mess.

NATIONAL NEWS HIGHLIGHTS

NSSF POLL: SUPPORT FOR GUN-CONTROL LAWS AT ALL-TIME LOWS . . . According to a recent Gallup poll, only 29 percent of Americans said the possession of handguns by private citizens should be banned, which is the smallest percentage favoring a handgun ban since Gallup first polled on this nearly 50 years ago. In another survey, Gallup found that Americans favoring stricter gun laws was at 49 percent, the lowest percentage since the question was first asked in 1990.

NSSF FBI-NICS BACKGROUND CHECKS HIT 100 MILLION . . . The FBI has announced the completion of the 100 millionth instant background check since the inception of its National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS) 10 years ago. "We congratulate FBI-NICS on this milestone," said NSSF President Steve Sanetti. "For 10 years and 100 million transactions, the FBI-NICS team has minimized complications and delays of firearm purchases, thereby benefiting America's retailers, law-abiding gun owners and the general public."

NSSF FIREARM SALES CONTINUE TO CLIMB IN MARCH . . . **NEWTOWN, Conn.** -- Firearm sales continued to surge across the country for the fifth straight month, extending a trend that began after the November elections. The increase also follows recent comments by several high-profile members of the Obama administration about re-imposing permanently and expanding the ban on modern sporting rifles.

Data from the FBI's National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS) show background checks on the sale of firearms jumped 29.2 percent in March when compared to March 2008 and were up 27.1 percent for the first quarter of 2009 over the same quarter last year.

The increase follows a 23 percent rise in February, a 28 percent rise in January, a 24 percent rise in December and a 42 percent jump in November, when a record 1,529,635 background checks were performed.

FBI background checks are required under federal law for all individuals purchasing firearms from federally licensed retailers. These checks serve as a strong indicator of actual sales.

Correspondingly, ammunition manufacturers are reporting record sales across the country as demand continues to outpace supply.

"Americans concerned about their ability to purchase many types of home defense, hunting and target shooting firearms in the future are continuing to purchase these products in record numbers today," said NSSF President Steve Sanetti. "Along with this strong sales showing, we've also seen increased participation in firearm safety and education programs such as NSSF First Shots."

NICS reported 1,345,096 checks in March, up from 1,040,863 in the same month a year ago.

NSSF AP: AMMO SHORTAGE DRIVEN BY FEAR OF NEW REGULATIONS . . . Retailers nationwide are reporting shortages of ammunition, particularly of popular handgun calibers. In an interview with the Associated Press, NSSF Senior Vice President and General Counsel Lawrence G. Keane discussed increased sales of firearms and ammunition and the resulting shortage. "We have heard from all across the country that there is a tremendous shortage of ammunition," said Keane. "We've heard this from the manufacturers, that their customers are calling them trying to get supplies for inventory, and that the manufacturers are going full-bore."

RED LIGHT, GREEN LIGHT

No, that's not right; it is RED line and YELLOW



line! On the main rifle range there is a RED line which is the down range firearm muzzle line and the YELLOW line which is the rear safety line. During a cease fire all people on the main rifle range must be down range of the RED line or behind the YELLOW safety line. Why? This policy is in place to prevent someone from handling, bumping, or discharging a firearm that is still on a shooting bench and eliminates the need to rack all firearms prior to a cease fire. In addition, when the range is hot all firearms should be discharged as close to the RED line as possible. When shooters stand back from

the RED line too far it can potentially put an adjacent shooter in danger by placing them down range from a firearm muzzle.

CONCEALED HANDGUN CLASSES

Albany Rifle and Pistol Club is conducting Oregon and Utah Concealed Handgun License



Courses on a monthly basis. The State of Oregon does not recognize concealed handgun licenses from any other state. In order to legally carry a concealed handgun as private citizen in the State of Oregon you must have a current Oregon Concealed Handgun License.

Completing the Utah Concealed Handgun License Course gives you the necessary education to apply via mail for a Utah Concealed Handgun license. Utah Concealed Handgun License is recognized in 32 states including Washington and Idaho but not Oregon. Please check the ARPC Calendar for dates, times and cost or call the club office at 541-619-0038 for additional information. All classes at ARPC are open to members and the public.

ARPC SMOKING POLICY CHANGE



There has been a recent change to bring ARPC's No Smoking Policy in line with the State of Oregon's No Smoking Policy. Smoking is allowed in all open shooting buildings and not allowed in closed buildings (or within 10 feet of a doorway), such as the main range classroom, trap building or the north range classroom.
