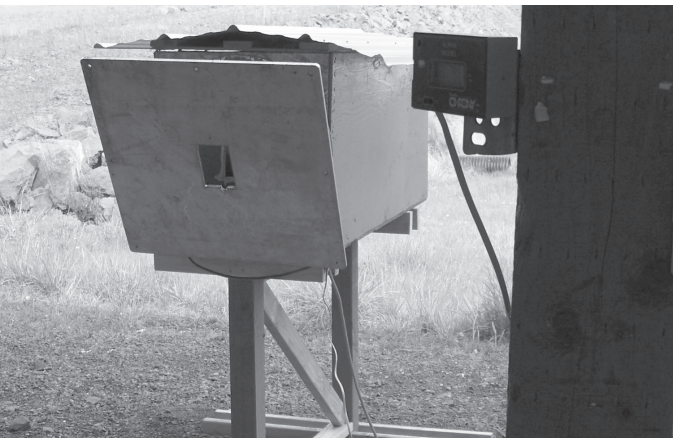
### PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

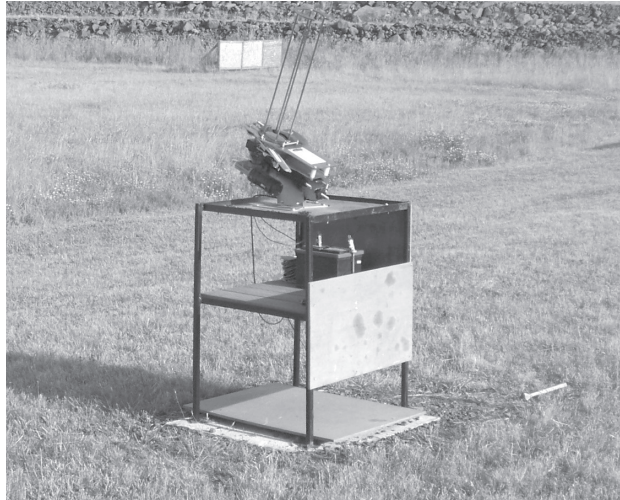

### ARPC ON THE "BIG STAGE"

Albany Rifle and Pistol Club hits the "Big Stage" this summer by promoting firearm

sport shooting to the public. The first event takes place at ARPC on the weekend of July 11th and 12th when two different State Games of Oregon venues compete at our club. The State Games of Oregon brings together Oregon athletes of all ages during July in every traditional sport to promote sports throughout our state. We have a chance to show the general public the sports side of firearm shooting. On July 11th the State Games of Oregon Biathlon event kicks off with a combination running and 22 caliber biathlon shooting event. Runners alternate running and shooting to see who can complete the course in the least amount of time while shooting rifles on the main range for score. On July 12th another shooting venue takes place when competitors from our club and all over the state compete in the CMP Sporter Rifle competition. This competition shoots at 25 and 50 yard targets with 22 caliber sporter rifles. Yes, both of these events are open to the public and ARPC members for not only viewing but participation.

### TRAP SHOOTING UPGRADE



If you like to shoot trap at ARPC at anytime you want and hate playing around with those hand throwing machines, have we got news for you. ARPC has installed not one but two different battery powered trap machines for you to use whenever you wish to shoot clay birds. The machine on the north end of the shotgun range is button activated and the machine on the south end of the shotgun range is foot pedal activated. Simply bring out your own birds, put them in the machine and start shooting clay pigeons with friends or by yourself. If you need help or instructions on how these machines work, we have printed them up and put them next to the machines. Should you still need help, check to see if Mike is in the club office or give Don Arnold a call at 541-491-1014.

Please make sure you stand in the shooting area behind each machine when shooting. This insures that all shot goes straight down range. Rifle and shotgun shooting can take place at the same time on the shotgun range, however it is important that all shooters communicate and shoot safely when co-using the shotgun range.

Wednesday afternoon group trap shooting starts at 12 noon instead of 4pm. If you want to come and shoot with the 'good old boys' or just have fun you can start shooting at 12 noon every Wednesday. Wednesday afternoons and the 1st Saturday afternoon are open for all members and the public.



The 2nd "Big Stage" item taking place this summer involves air rifle shooting at the Oregon State Fair. Barbara Shew, one of our junior discipline directors, along with her husband Nelson host the air rifle tent at the Oregon State Fair. This is the 3rd year that Barbara and Nelson have run this program at the fair and last year over 3200 people came through the tent. The air rifle tent was the 2nd most attended sporting demonstration at the fair last year. In order to put on an event that attracts this many people takes a large number of volunteers. You don't have to know how it works, just raise your hand and let Barbara or Nelson know you want to help out at the fair. Think about this, work bond hours, good weather, free parking, free fair admission and fun, what more could you ask for? Give Barbara (541-451-2047) a call if you can help out at the fair this year.

The more ARPC gets promoted, along with positive firearm fun, at events of this caliber the more people get the message that shooting guns can be fun.

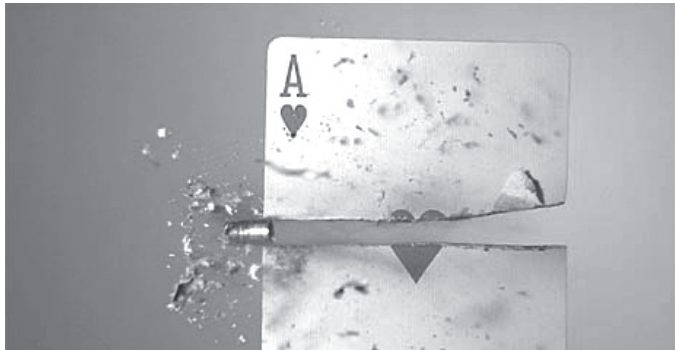

**ARPC PRO SHOP**



The ARPC Pro Shop is trying to help out ARPC members by bringing in bullets for reloading, primers and loaded ammunition. Please watch the 'For Sale' board in the main range clubhouse to see what there is in stock.

We know that the lack of loaded ammunition and components for reloading is restricting many members who would like to come out and shoot at the range. There have been shipments of ammunition and primers arriving at local stores recently and we hope that overall inventories improve throughout the next few months.

The ARPC Pro Shop currently has 9mm, 38 special and 223 ammunition on its way in to the club. In addition, we have on order 160,000 primers and 80,000 pistol bullets on order. We will limit the amount of product purchased by any one member through the Pro Shop to help out as many members as possible.

**RANGE MASTER'S REPORT**

Stay tuned, check the web calendar and watch for the summer projects to start soon. Projected construction projects at the club include the remodeling and handicap restroom upgrade of the main range clubhouse, trial target system on the main range, shelters on the east range, expanded parking on the north range and opening of the archery area.



It is hard to schedule exact starting dates on many of these projects and schedule them on the newsletter calendar due to volunteer help, permit approval and availability of materials. ## JUNIORS NEEDED FOR THE ARPC JUNIOR TRAP TEAMS

Now, the farmers' cooperative owns twenty-three stores, scattered through the Northwest on both sides of the US-Canadian border.

"Wholesale Sports is excited to be part of 15 new communities," says Chuck Cote, divisional president, Wholesale Sports. "We've got the same great employees our customers know and trust and stores with everything you need to get outdoors."
