POLICE DEPARTMENTS AT THE RANGE

Most of the time the police departments that train at ARPC schedule their training sessions on the club calendar, but there are times when they come out to the club to do some remedial work with an officer or use a bay adjacent to their training. Almost all of the officers who are firearms instructors with these police agencies are members of ARPC and do not have to schedule facility use for this purpose. If you see police cars on the north range and don't see anything on the schedule, understand that they are members and have as much right to club facilities as any other member.

We appreciate the relationship we have with these agencies and the support that they bring to our club. Approximately 6% of ARPC members are law enforcement.

RANGE MASTER REPORT

The Executive Board, Discipline Directors and work bond workers try very hard to keep Albany Rifle and Pistol Club looking the best it can throughout the year. We are very proud of our club and understand that members, guests and newcomers like to see everything clean, neat and working when they come out to the range.

If you see something that doesn't work, needs fixing or needs to be cleaned up, please say something to me or leave a note next to the office in the main classroom. If we don't know about a problem we can't fix it. Please don't assume someone else has mentioned the problem.

This situation has come to light recently with the addition of the chronograph and the new trap machines on the shotgun range. Low hits on the chronograph box break the lights within the box. When this happens the readings on the chronograph error out and you know there is a problem. If you break the lights with a low hit please let someone know so we can replace the bulbs. One of the battery-powered trap machines blew a fuse and the operator didn't let us know that it wasn't working. It was a cheap fix but no one said anything until several days later.

Safety Alert: When you talk to someone on the main range and agree to go to a 'Cease-fire', give them time to shoot their last round and clear their shooting bench before you hit the buzzer and walk down range. Don't just assume that they have cleared their shooting bench because you pushed the button.

WARNING - WARNING - WARNING

You walk across the parking lot, unlock your car door and get inside. You start the engine and shift into reverse. When you look into the rearview mirror to back out of your parking

space, you notice a piece of paper stuck to the middle of the rear window. So, you shift into park, unlock your door and jump out of your car to remove the paper or whatever it is that is obstructing your view. When you reach the back of your car the carjackers appear out of nowhere, jump into your car and take off.

And guess what, ladies? Your purse is probably still in the car and the carjacker has your car, your home address, your money and your keys. This is not a joke. When you see a piece of paper on your window after you have unlocked and started the engine, just drive away and check it when you get a chance in a safe location.

NORTH RANGE RULE CHANGE



Effective July 1, 2009, you can now shoot all types of firearms except for "rifle caliber full auto" in the North Range Shooting Bays. This includes all pistol, rifle, shotgun, black powder and pistol caliber full auto calibers. Note: steel core and steel jacketed ammunition cannot be used on any ARPC range.

CHAMPS CROWNED AT YOUTH HUNTER EDUCATION CHALLENGE



FAIRFAX, VIRGINIA- The foothills of the Rocky Mountains served as the backdrop for the NRA's 24th Annual Youth Hunter Education Challenge (YHEC) at the NRA Whittington Center in Raton, New Mexico. From July 27-31, over 310 of the country's most skilled young hunters competed against one another, putting their marksmanship and outdoor skills to the test.

Often referred to as NRA's "graduate" program in hunter education, YHEC is comprised of eight events that test hunting knowledge and marksmanship skills. Four of the eight events are shooting-related, with participants competing in shotgun, muzzleloader, rifle, and archery challenges.

The remaining four events, known as responsibility events, put the participants' hunting knowledge to the ultimate test. These events include orienteering, a written test called the Hunter Responsibility Exam, a wildlife identification course, and the Hunter Safety Trail where the young hunters must use their judgment during simulated hunting scenarios.

Each year, approximately 50,000 youth take part in YHEC events at a regional, state, or provincial level throughout the United States and Canada. The International event is open to all young hunters who have successfully completed a North American hunter education course and participated in their regional, state, or provincial YHEC program. Since its inception in 1985, YHEC has helped more than 1.2 million young sportsmen and women become safe, ethical and skilled hunters.

Oregon's Casy Carlson finished third in Senior Individuals, Oregon's Junior Team took second and Oregon's Senior Team took second. For more information about YHEC go to www.nrahq.org/hunting/yhec/index.asp.

NORTH RANGE BAY USE

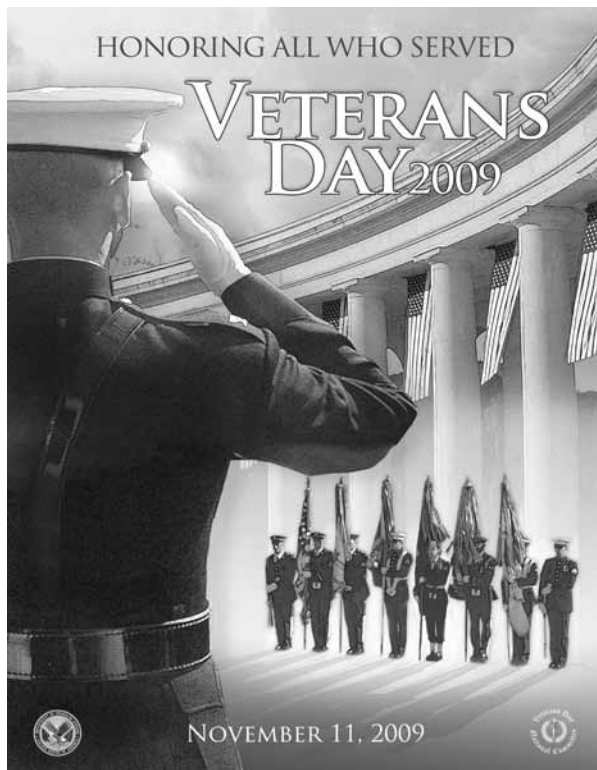

When you find an empty bay and want to use it, simply put the cone out in front of the door with the sign pointing towards the road. This gives everyone passing by an idea of which bays are in use. When you are done shooting move the cone back inside the building.
