THE 20TH ANNUAL SHOOTOUT AT SADDLE BUTTE



State Championship of Cowboy Action Shooting was held this past weekend, August 14-16, at the Albany Rifle and Pistol Club, (ARPC) near Shedd. The Oregon Old West Shooting Society (OOWSS) hosted 219 shooters from as far away as Florida, Texas, Utah, and Idaho, along with the usual suspects from Oregon, Washington and California.



This year's match saw the weather man cooperating, providing cool, partly cloudy conditions, which added to the enjoyment of the shooting and festivities. There were approximately 85 campers and RV's spaced out in three football field long rows, just beyond Vendors Row, where 20 Vendors both local, and from as far away as Florida plied their wares from tents and tables. The main feature of the encampment was the huge 120 by 40 foot tent, which was the focal point of meetings, lunches, dinners, Match Sponsors, and general seating. As usual, the main road and bays were flanked by American flags, flying in the breeze.

The stages for this match were all based on chapters from the novel "Killing Buck Castillo", written by our own Don "Flint McCloud" Frazer. From a full-sized "Spanish Rose Saloon" front, complete with bat-wing saloon doors, to buck-boards, mission fronts, and plenty of plywood cowboys and horses, the OOWSS folks put a lot of thought and effort into building props and shooting scenarios. The three day event started Friday, August 14th with side matches featuring cowboy trap, long-range rifle and speed pistol, rifle and shotgun. One fun side was, a derringer and pocket pistol "card hand" shoot, with the winners either scoring the tightest group, or best random card hand.



August 15 & 16, with 6 stages completed each day, before a lunch break featuring great catered food by Jacopetti's Cafe and Bakery of Albany.

A bay was set up by members of the Oregon Cowboy Fast Draw Association, where folks could try their hand at this exciting sport.

Prizes were randomly awarded throughout the final day, with Dillon 550, and 650 reloading presses given out, along with an 1866 Uberti "yellow boy" rifle, a sesqui-centennial Pendleton blanket, Lindholm spurs, and many other fine gifts including a 45 long colt revolver.

The "Sons Of The Butte" Vigilance Committee awarded an "Atlas carrying the world on his shoulders" chrome hood ornament circa 1941 Cadillac mounted on a custom wooden base to Buckshot Shell-E, aka Michelle Reagan

of Lebanon, for all of her countless hours of scorekeeping and background work for the match.

Brass was picked up and returned to each shooter courtesy of the Albany Boy Scout troop who earned tips for their scouting events.



Breakfast was also available from our Oregon State award winning camp cook, Isaac Scrambler Day, aka David Lemons of Salem, offering up cast-iron dutch oven blueberry pancakes, sausages, and cowboy-style coffee from his authentic 1880's chuck wagon, and charging only donations for the feast.



Saturday evening hosted the Wedding of Tracy "Gunfight" Hite, and Linda "Tuffy Tumbleweed" Pynch, both from Brownsville, complete with the bride arriving in a 1908 Oldsmobile replica built by Just Bill, aka Bill Longiotti of Talent. It was a very nice ceremony with a group of cowboys forming a "shot gun" arch through which the couple promenaded out, ending with the sounds of blanks being fired into the air.



Sunday morning started with Cowboy Church, led by Pastor Dan Vickers of Corvallis and his group from the Corvallis Cowboy Church.

The awards ceremony awarded the 2009 Oregon State Champion buckles to Last Chance Morales, aka Chance Koch of Redmond, and the Ladies winner, Buckshot Shell-E, aka Michelle Reagan of Lebanon. Overall Match Winners were Badland

Buds, aka Steven Rubert of Rescue, California and Pinto Annie, aka LeAnn Kemmerer of Dayton, Washington. Pinto Annie is a former Washington State and NW Regional Ladies Champion as Badlands Bud is a two time Overall World Champion and this year's National Champion. We were honored to have both of them here with us.

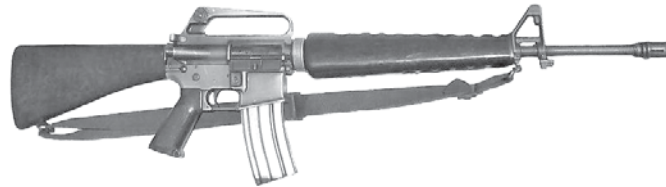

ARPC ANNUAL MEETING

Each year, in November, ARPC holds its annual meeting. 6203 This year the annual meeting is scheduled for Friday evening, November 13th from 7 pm to 8:30 pm at the Linn County Fair and Exposition Center, Rooms 3 & 4. Dessert will be served during the meeting. Members and their guests are invited to the meeting, but only members are eligible for door prizes. During the meeting we usually give away several door prizes including firearms to members who attend. In addition, new Executive Board officers are elected. If you want to step up to the plate and have a bigger say in how the club operates or which direction new construction goes then throw your hat into the ring. NORTH RANGE RULE CHANGE



Effective July 1, 2009, you can now shoot all types of firearms except for "rifle caliber full auto" in the North Range Shooting Bays. This includes all pistol, rifle, shotgun, black powder and pistol caliber full auto calibers. Note: steel core and steel jacketed ammunition cannot be used on any ARPC range.

POLICE DEPARTMENTS AT THE RANGE



Most of the time the police departments that train at ARPC schedule their training sessions on the club calendar, but there are times when they come out to the club to do some remedial work with an officer or use a bay adjacent to their training. Almost all of the officers who are firearms instructors with these police agencies are members

of ARPC and do not have to schedule facility use for this purpose. If you see police cars on the north range and don't see anything on the schedule, understand that they are members and have as much right to club facilities as any other member.

We appreciate the relationship we have with these agencies and the support that they bring to our club. Approximately 6% of ARPC members are law enforcement.

RANGE MASTER REPORT

Many of our members find it hard to work at the club and get in work bond hours during scheduled work bond on Saturdays or during special events. If you want to work at the club on your schedule when you have time, just give me a call ahead of time, and let's see what we can come up with. Most of the time there is plenty of work to be done; more in the summer and less in the winter, but there is always day-to-day maintenance that needs to be done.



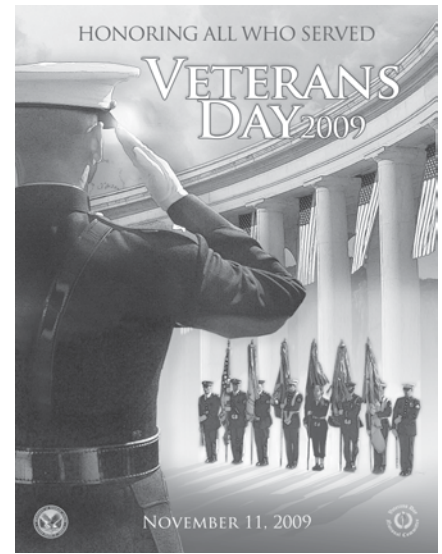
Here is a reminder about work bond hours and how the system works. The work bond calendar year begins April 1st which is the beginning of ARPC's fiscal year. If you are an individual member it takes 12 or more work bond hours to reduce your dues payment from \$135 to \$60 a year. Less than 12 hours of work bond does not reduce your annual dues. After a work bond Saturday or special event it takes up to 30 days to get it recorded into the system, so you may not see it on your newsletter right away due to the printing cutoff date of the newsletter. If you want to keep closer track of your work bond hours then sign up for your own online page within the ARPC database. It costs nothing and gives you access to your own club information whenever you want to look at it. If you are interested in your own online page then contact the webmaster at the ARPC website.

Many of ARPC's club functions are run by volunteers just like you. If you find something wrong with your work bond hours, gate card, addresses or other information just give the ARPC office a call and we will try to get things straightened out.

NORTH RANGE BAY USE

How many times have you driven down past the north range bays and wondered which bays were open for shooting? We now have a new system in place to help you find an empty bay. In each bay building there is an orange safety cone that has an 'In Use' sign attached to it. When you find an empty bay and want to use it, simply put the cone out in front of the door with the sign pointing towards the road. This gives everyone passing by an idea of which bays are in use. When you are done shooting move the cone back inside the building.



Remember, we share space on all ranges at ARPC. Just because you are in a bay it doesn't mean that you don't have to share space with other members. Be a good club member and welcome others into the bay you are shooting in. When more than one group is shooting in a bay communication is a must to keep everyone safe.

BLACK POWDER AND FOOD

Yup! Seems like during the winter all you can do is stuff them rifles full of black powder, light them up and eat. Well, at least that's what Ed Eriksen and the muzzle loader folks want to do on Sunday, November 1st. They will be shooting black powder cartridge rifles on the first Saturday of every month, main range at 1pm.



If you think the movie, Quigley Down Under, exaggerated the ability of the black powder cartridge rifle then listen to this. 56122 One of our black powder cartridge shooters shot a 1.75" 5 shot group at 200 yards with iron sights and a 500 +/- grain bullet. How many folks can shoot that with a scoped rifle? These guns are really fun to shoot. I bet Zene would even let you behind the sights on one of his rifles if you want to try one out.
