RANGE MASTER REPORT

Safety is the most important priority at Albany Rifle and Pistol Club in everything we do. Whether we are talking about members' use, guests' use or during any event, we always have think about keeping the range safe.



Every year just prior to, and during hunting season, members bring a lot of guests to the club to sight in their rifles. Members must always take the responsibility for their guests and everything safety related. Discipline Directors must make sure that everyone who participates in their events knows and follows all range safety rules. Just because someone is a visitor at ARPC is no excuse to break safety rules or handle firearms dangerously.

I want to urge all Range Officers and members at ARPC to look for potential safety problems when they are at the club. If you come across a potential problem make sure you approach the person in the same way you would like to be talked to. There is no place on the range for anger or blowing your top. It is also not necessary to write up every little safety issue. Major safety violations should be written up on incident

forms located near the black mail box in the main range classroom and deposited in the box. The Executive Board reviews all incident forms for further action, if necessary. If you have to write something up make sure you get as much information as possible.

We have had some complaints about members (who were not wearing their name badge) approaching other members about a potential safety issue and getting mad. Does it sound like a good policy to start hollering at someone who has a gun? Should you run into a problem with another club member and you don't want to deal with it just give the Range Master or any member of the Executive Board a call. We will respond immediately.

Remember, the best way to teach safety is to demonstrate safety. Safety doesn't start when you come through the main gate. You should be safe at the range, on the road to the range, handling firearms in your home and whenever you are around firearms anywhere.

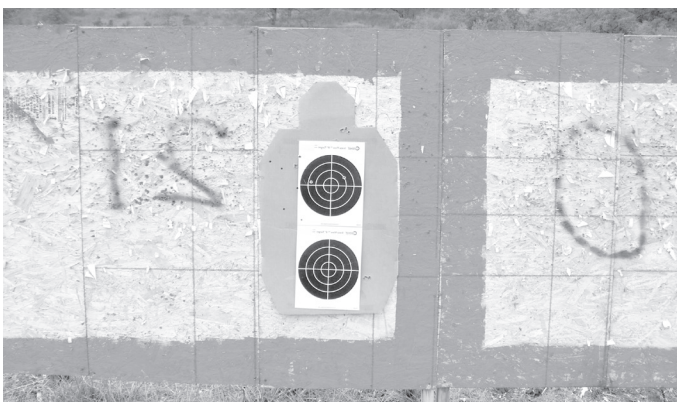

area. Always leave the range in better shape than when you find it. A clean range makes it nice for the next club member and shows how much we care about this great facility. If you see abandoned targets left up by other members please remove them when you take down your targets. Several times during the week we do tours for potential new members, a clean range makes a great first impression.



North range users have the same responsibility to remove targets and sweep up when they are finished using a shooting bay. Don't leave used targets in the shooting bays. Either take them home to recycle, put them back in the target bin or get rid of them in the garbage. If you bring wood or targets other than paper/cardboard out to shoot, take them home with you. Don't leave the mess for other people to clean up. Hang brooms and dust pans up when you finish using them.

Remember to move your 'In Use' orange cones back inside the bay when you are done using the bay.



Clean up your shotgun shells, clay target boxes and shell boxes when you finish shooting on the shotgun range.

EYE AND EAR PROTECTION

Eye and Ear Protection is mandatory on all shooting ranges at ARPC. This is true for both shooters and bystanders. A loud noise to your hearing hurts and probably won't



give you any long term damage but a hit to the eye can be permanent. Regular eye glasses will work for most safety situations but wrap around shooting or safety glasses are better. Ear plugs, muffs or electronic noise canceling ear protection handles most noise situations at the range; however it may be necessary to double up ear protection with very loud firearms.

Eye protection is the most violated safety rule at ARPC. There is no room for discussion when it comes to safety; it is either the range rules way or the highway. Should you feel that a safety rule

is burdensome or needs to be changed, give the Chief Range Safety Officer a call. ARPC board members are always willing to listen to constructive suggestions when it comes to range safety rules.

NEW ARPC RANGE OWNERS

Did you know that Albany Rifle and Pistol Club is wholly owned by the membership? Yes, that means every existing and new member to the club owns part of ARPC. True, ARPC is a LLC (Limited Liability Corporation) but that only protects you as an owner. As long as you are a member of the club you share this responsibility with every other member. Does this change the way you look at ARPC, the way you take care of it and the way you show it off to your friends? Think about this the next time you come out to the club, hear about a work party or have the opportunity to represent the club.



AVOID INCREASED LEAD LEVELS

Wash your hands often when shooting to avoid ingesting lead into your body. Lead residue is a fact when you are around firearms, not to mention powder residue and strong chemicals. By washing your hands during shooting sessions you reduce the odds of getting these harmful metals and chemicals into your body. Wash you hands prior to using the restroom, eating or smoking cigarettes. In addition, take special precautions when reloading ammunition and cleaning your firearms at home. Practice good personal hygiene when around firearms and ammunition.



RECYCLE YOUR EMPTY SHELL BOXES

Empty shell holders and boxes are now being recycled at ARPC. There are recycle bins on the main range and in every shooting bay on the range for this purpose. The ARPC junior program

gets 10 cents for every complete tray and box that is recycled at the club. To date, the juniors have earned over \$38 dollars in recycled boxes. Please put trays / boxes in the recycle bin and not garbage. Garbage should be put in the metal garbage cans.

FIRST AID KITS

First Aid Kits are available on all ranges at ARPC. These kits have alcohol swabs, band aids and other first aid supplies available to shooters. Please take a moment and notice where these kits are located on the main range, shotgun range and north range. We have placed these kits so they are available without having to go through locked doors to get to them.



SHOTGUN RANGE CHANGES

Over the last year ARPC has installed two new battery powered clay bird throwers. These machines are available to members to use at any time when the big trap machine is not scheduled. Hand throwing clay bird throwers are not allowed on the shotgun range. It is too easy to launch shotgun pellets over the north range berms when using hand clay bird throwers. Save your arm and use the battery powered machines.



NEW LOOK NORTH RANGE CLASSROOM



The north range classroom is now "Second Amendment blue" to match the rest of the buildings at ARPC. Both the north range classroom and the shotgun range storage conex were recently painted blue just like the other buildings on the range. 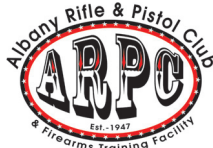

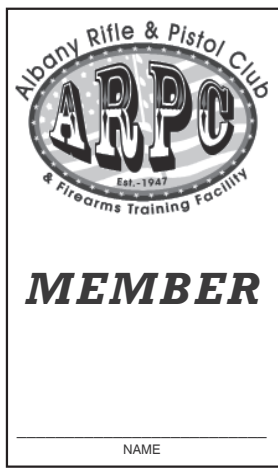

ARPC NAME BADGES

When you are at Albany Rifle and Pistol Club you must wear your name badge to identify yourself as a club member. Don't get upset if you are not wearing your name badge and someone walks up to you and asks "are you a member of the club?" We have found non-members or guests of a member using the club without permission. If you bring guests into the club to shoot with you, sign them in and fill out a guest badge.



Wearing your name badge at the club gives other members an opportunity to introduce themselves and see your name. It is always nice to be able to ask a member a question when you know their name. Just stop in the main range classroom and pick up a new sticker for your name badge if yours needs replacing. We can even printout your name to go on your new sticker for you. The stickers are in the same box as the visitor badges.

WORK BOND CHANGES

The first Saturday morning of the month work bond party system is changing. Over the last year we have noticed an increased number of people coming out to participate in the work bond program. Don Arnold never has an idea in advance of how many people will show up for work and what kind of projects they can handle. He is now asking you to call in the week prior to work bond Saturday to let him know you are coming. This will give Don the opportunity to prepare materials for projects he knows the crew can complete. Either give Don at (541)491-1014 or Mike a call at the club office, (541)619-0038 to let them know you will be at work bond Saturday.



If you plan on getting your work bond hours in before renewal time, do not wait until the last minute because weather and number of projects available to work on might cut work bond Saturdays short. Please give Mike a call if you can work during the week because we do have projects available that can be worked on mid-week.

CLUB ELECTIONS

Club elections are coming up at the November ARPC Annual Meeting. Currently we have nominations for President, Vice-President, Treasurer and Executive Officer. We still have openings for Secretary and Chief Range Safety Officer. Just because there are

LOST AND FOUND

If you find something left on any ARPC range turn it in at the main range classroom. If you take it then you are stealing from a fellow member. Leave anything you find on the table in the main classroom with a note about where you found it. Lost and found items will be saved for six months and then sold to benefit the junior program if

it is an item worth selling; otherwise it will be given to the needy. If you find a firearm left on any range (yes, this does happen) do not leave it in the main range classroom. Call the Range Master, Mike McCarter, or any of the Executive Board and let them know what you found. Phone numbers are posted next to the emergency phone in the main range classroom. Someone on the Executive Board will make arrangements to get the firearm from you.

MOVING INDOORS IN THE WINTER



The north range is a busy place any time of the year. When winter weather sets in the seven north range bays get even busier. Always watch the schedule to see who is scheduled on the north range and what bays they will be using. If you have a question about this use give the person who has their name on the calendar a call and ask them about it. When bays are available, other than scheduled bays, share with fellow club members just like any other range at ARPC. Remember, when you share a bay then safety levels go up and you must communicate with the people you are sharing the bay with to keep the range safe.

TARGETS FOR SALE

We have targets for sale in the main range classroom. These targets come in a pad of 40 targets for \$5. If you want to purchase any of these targets it is self service, just put your money in the payment can attached to the target shelf. In addition, you can find safety glasses and ear protection for sale adjacent to the targets. Payment for these items is on the honor system.



NEW ENTRANCE SIGN

ARPC has upgraded the entrance sign to the club. The new sign is lighted using low voltage lights which will give visitors the opportunity to pick up membership information during low light days and provide some ambient light for the main entrance gate.



ALCOHOL AND DRUGS



ARPC has recently put up new 'No Alcohol and Drug' signs throughout the club. Some members like to use empty cans as targets on the north range. Not only is alcohol banned at ARPC but also empty alcohol containers, because they lead members to believe that someone is drinking and shooting at the range.

If you see someone drinking or acting drunk at

the range, immediately call the Range Master or any member of the Executive Board. Phone numbers are posted next to the emergency phone in the main range clubhouse.

NEW JUNIOR BADGES ARE AVAILABLE

If you are a junior member at ARPC or know of one get in touch with the club office. We have new ARPC Junior Member badges and we want every ARPC Junior to wear a club badge. In addition, we will have a new ARPC Junior email newsletter available soon that will go out to all juniors who sign up for it on a monthly basis.

What is the advantage of being a Junior Member at ARPC? It costs only \$5 per year, you get into both ARPC Gun Shows free, you get into the Saddle Butte Machine Gun Shoot free, you get into Hunter's Sight In Days free and when you become 18 you can upgrade your membership to an individual membership without having to pay the \$100 initiation fee. Junior members do not need to be sponsored by an adult member to become a junior member. Note: Junior member badges do not open ARPC gates or doors. Junior members must be supervised by an adult in order to use any ARPC shooting range.
