2009 ARPC ANNUAL MEETING

Linn Co. Exposition Center, November 13, 2009.

The 2009 Albany Rifle and Pistol Club Annual Meeting opened at 7:05pm with close to 80 club members plus guests in attendance. The Annual Meeting began with Pledge of Allegiance and introductions of the 2008-09 Executive Board and club members in attendance. During the Officer's reports Bob Hamilton and Don Arnold were awarded their 1,000 hours of work bond plaques



and during the discipline reports Barbara Shew was awarded her 1,000 hours of work bond plaque. Club President Steve Shippey has made it his priority to recognize those members of the club who go above and beyond with their contributions to the club. John Van Why, club webmaster, was awarded his 500 hour work bond plaque even though he could not be at the meeting.

After the discipline reports, Steve Shippey moved into Old Business which included reports on the club's new conditional use permit application, 2009 Gun Show recaps, Hunters Sight In Days, Oregon State Fair Air Rifle report and a review of the 2009 Strategic Plan accomplishments. ARPC Executive Board officers monitor the strategic plan at each E-Board meeting to determine which work items the club needs to focus on. SMITH & WESSON REVOLVER SAFETY



JUDGE REJECTS CLAIM THAT PISTOL DIDN'T HAVE ADEQUATE WARNINGS . . . On Aug. 20, a judge ruled that Smith & Wesson wasn't to blame for an incident that caused a shooter to lose a finger (Foltz v. Smith & Wesson Corp.), reports Texas Lawyer magazine. In 2006, Roger Foltz was firing his .460 revolver and placed his finger between the cylinder and the back of the barrel. When he fired, the hot, pressurized gasses escaped in the area where he had placed his finger and partially amputated it. Smith & Wesson

successfully argued the safety manual included with the pistol specifically and sufficiently warned users against placing their fingers where Foltz placed his. According to the court, makers and sellers of firearms have no duty to warn of the obvious dangers of owning or selling a handgun.

EYE AND EAR PROTECTION

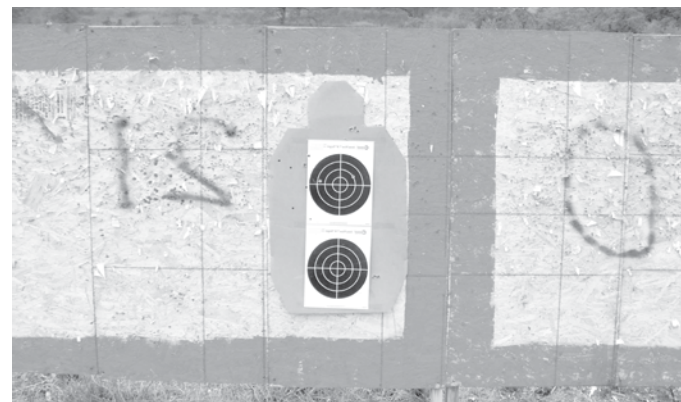
Eye and Ear Protection is mandatory on all shooting ranges at ARPC. This is true for both shooters and bystanders. A loud noise to your hearing hurts and probably won't give you any long term damage but a hit to the eye can be permanent. Regular eye glasses will work for most safety situations but wrap around shooting or safety glasses are better. Ear plugs, muffs or electronic noise canceling ear protection handles most noise situations at the range; however it may be necessary to double up ear protection with very loud firearms.



Eye protection is the most violated safety rule at ARPC. There is no room for discussion when it comes to safety; it is either the range rules way or the highway. Should you feel that a safety rule is burdensome or needs to be changed, give the Chief Range Safety Officer a call. ARPC board members are always willing to listen to constructive suggestions when it comes to range safety rules.

RANGE CLEANLINESS

When you finish shooting on the main range remove your targets and clean up your shooting area. Always leave the range in better shape than when you find it. A clean range makes it nice for the next club member and shows how much we care about this great facility. If you see abandoned targets left up by other members please remove them when you take down your targets. Several times during the week we do tours for potential new members, a clean range makes a great first impression.



North range users have the same responsibility to remove targets and sweep up when they are finished using a shooting bay. Don't leave used targets in the shooting bays. Either take them home to recycle, put them back in the target bin or get rid of them in the garbage. If you bring wood or targets other than paper/cardboard out to shoot, take them home with you. Don't leave the mess for other people to clean up. Hang brooms and dust pans up when you finish using them.

Remember to move your 'In Use' orange cones back inside the bay when you are done using the bay. 28807

NEW ARPC RANGE OWNERS

Did you know that Albany Rifle and Pistol Club is wholly owned by the membership? Yes, that means every existing and new member to the club owns part of ARPC. True, ARPC is a LLC (Limited Liability Corporation) but that only protects you as an owner. As long as you are a member of the club you share this responsibility with every other member. Does this change the way you look at ARPC, the way you take care of it and the way you show it off to your friends? Think about this the next time you come out to the club, hear about a work party or have the opportunity to represent the club.



AVOID INCREASED LEAD LEVELS

Wash your hands often when shooting to avoid ingesting lead into your body. Lead residue is a fact when you are around firearms, not to mention powder residue and strong chemicals. By washing your hands during shooting sessions you reduce the odds of getting these harmful metals and chemicals into your body. Wash your hands prior to using the restroom, eating or smoking cigarettes. In addition, take special precautions when reloading ammunition and cleaning your firearms at home. Practice good personal hygiene when around firearms and ammunition.



RECYCLE YOUR EMPTY SHELL BOXES

Empty shell holders and boxes are now being recycled at ARPC. There are recycle bins on the main range and in every shooting bay on the range for this purpose. The ARPC junior program gets 10 cents for every complete tray and box that is recycled at the club. To date, the juniors have earned over \$38 dollars in recycled boxes. Please put trays / boxes in the recycle bin and not garbage. Garbage should be put in the metal garbage cans.

FIRST AID KITS

First Aid Kits are available on all ranges at ARPC. These kits have alcohol swabs, band aids and other first aid supplies available to shooters. Please take a moment and notice where these kits are located on the main range, shotgun range and north range. We have placed these kits so they are available without having to go through locked doors to get to them.



SHOTGUN RANGE CHANGES

Over the last year ARPC has installed two new battery powered clay bird throwers. These machines are available to members to use at any time when the big trap machine is not scheduled. Hand throwing clay bird throwers are not allowed on the shotgun range. It is too easy to launch shotgun pellets over the north range berms when using hand clay bird throwers. Save your arm and use the battery powered machines.



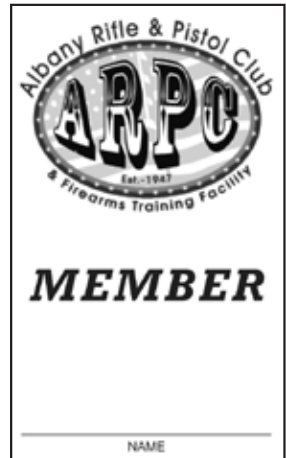
NEW LOOK NORTH RANGE CLASSROOM



The north range classroom is now "Second Amendment blue" to match the rest of the buildings at ARPC. Both the north range classroom and the shotgun range storage conex were recently painted blue just like the other buildings on the range. The painting contractor told us a funny story about getting the paint color matched and discovered that the blue we use is called "Second Amendment blue." We can't think of a more appropriate name to identify our true colors. The shotgun range storage conex will soon have signs directing people to various parts of the club range.

ARPC NAME BADGES

When you are at Albany Rifle and Pistol Club you must wear your name badge to identify yourself as a club member. Don't get upset if you are not wearing your name badge and someone walks up to you and asks "are you a member of the club?" We have found non-members or guests of a member using the club without permission. If you bring guests into the club to shoot with you, sign them in and fill out a guest badge.



Wearing your name badge at the club gives other members an opportunity to introduce themselves and see your name. It is always nice to be able to ask a member a question when you know their name. Just stop in the main range classroom and pick up a new sticker for your name badge if yours needs replacing. We can even printout your name to go on your new sticker for you. The stickers are in the same box as the visitor badges.

WORK BOND CHANGES

The first Saturday morning of the month work bond party system is changing. Over the last year we have noticed an increased number of people coming out to participate in the work bond program. Don Arnold never has an idea in advance of how many people will show up for work and what kind of projects they can handle. He is now asking you to call in the week prior to work bond Saturday to let him know you are coming. This will give Don the opportunity to prepare materials for projects he knows the crew can complete. Either give Don at (541)491-1014 or Mike a call at the club office, (541)619-0038 to let them know you will be at work bond Saturday.



If you plan on getting your work bond hours in before renewal time, do not wait until the last minute because weather and number of projects available to work on might cut work bond Saturdays short. Please give Mike a call if you can work during the week because we do have projects available that can be worked on mid-week. 6225

LOST AND FOUND

If you find something left on any ARPC range turn it in at the main range classroom. If you take it then you are stealing from a fellow member. Leave anything you find on the table in the main classroom with a note about where you found it. Lost and found items will be saved for six months and then sold to benefit the junior program if it is an item worth selling; otherwise it will be given to the needy. If you find a firearm left on any range (yes, this does happen) do not leave it in the main range classroom. Call the Range Master, Mike McCarter, or any of the Executive Board and let them know what you found. Phone numbers are posted next to the emergency phone in the main range classroom. Someone on the Executive Board will make arrangements to get the firearm from you.

MOVING INDOORS IN THE WINTER



The north range is a busy place any time of the year. When winter weather sets in the seven north range bays get even busier. Always watch the schedule to see who is scheduled on the north range and what bays they will be using. If you have a question about this use give the person who has their name on the calendar a call and ask them about it. When bays are available, other than scheduled bays, share with fellow club members just like any other range at ARPC. Remember, when you share a bay then safety levels go up and you must communicate with the people you are sharing the bay with to keep the range safe.

If you want to purchase any of these targets it is self service, just put your money in the payment can attached to the target shelf. In addition, you can find safety glasses and ear protection for sale adjacent to the targets. Payment for these items is on the honor system.



NEW ENTRANCE SIGN

ARPC has upgraded the entrance sign to the club. The new sign is lighted using low voltage lights which will give visitors the opportunity to pick up membership information during low light days and provide some ambient light for the main entrance gate.



ALCOHOL AND DRUGS

ARPC has recently put up new 'No Alcohol and Drug' signs throughout the club. Some members like to use empty cans as targets on the north range.



Not only is alcohol banned at ARPC but also empty alcohol containers, because they lead members to believe that someone is drinking and shooting at the range.

If you see someone drinking or acting drunk at the range, immediately call the Range Master or any member of the Executive Board. Phone numbers are posted next to the emergency phone in the main range clubhouse.

NEW JUNIOR BADGES ARE AVAILABLE

If you are a junior member at ARPC or know of one get in touch with the club office. We have new ARPC Junior Member badges and we want every ARPC Junior to wear a club badge. In addition, we will have a new ARPC Junior email newsletter available soon that will go out to all juniors who sign up for it on a monthly basis.

What is the advantage of being a Junior Member at ARPC? It costs only \$5 per year, you get into both ARPC Gun Shows free, you get into the Saddle Butte Machine Gun Shoot free, you get into Hunter's Sight In Days free and when you become 18 you can upgrade your membership to an individual membership without having to pay the \$100 initiation fee. TRAP/XO REPORT

I am still seeing targets being left on the target boards. I know it is picky, but the reason for my interest is because targets are mostly made of paper of low quality paper and end up blowing off into the hinterland. Often times they go over to our neighbors field. Not good. 'Nuf about that.



Now for the big one. Our last newsletter addressed the safety issue in a big way. I guess some don't read the letter because everything that was addressed happened. We had a shooter start shooting before work bond ended. One of our members ran up onto the main range and made a not too friendly confrontation with the shooter. The shooter then took exception and the main confrontation took place. Yes, everything was calmed down without further incident. There were several things that went wrong. One: shooting before work bond was over. For everyone's information, unless there is a special program going on, the ENTIRE RANGE is shut down for work bond: no one is allowed to shoot during work bond. Two: not paying attending to range rules. I know everyone who signed up to join this range went through orientation and took a test. Three: no confrontations. We are all in this together. A simple reminder can cure most problems. If it takes more, call me or get the Range Master. If it takes more than that, it is time for 911, a membership gets pulled and that person is no longer welcome at this range.

Never, NEVER, get yourself into a confrontation, it isn't worth it. Finally the last mistake was made by me. I didn't get the name of the person who started the whole thing. If there is a violation of range rules that takes more than a "hey there," get a name and fill out an incident report. The board will take it from there.

Now for the good stuff. Our work bond crew did a great job. The only item not done was painting the red around the target boards. Things are really looking good and that takes more than the work bond crew can do. Thank you everyone.

By the time this hits the press it will be December. Turkeys, hams and everything will have been consumed. We will have one more month to go and another year will be gone.

On to Trap. I have changed the times for trap. This was done so we don't have to make any more trips to the range than necessary. Adult trap starts at noon on Wed and stops at 6:00pm. The junior program then starts and continues on to 8:00pm. If an adult comes in after six, we can work something out. We have from five to nine juveniles show up and they are really showing improvement. That is really good to see. If you have a child, grandchild or a neighbor child who wants to give it a try, come on out. If nothing else, come out to see what it is all about.

2009 CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT UPDATE

The Executive Board and Range Master have been working for almost two years to put together a new conditional use permit to operate ARPC in Linn County. It is not possible to update the existing permit and thus the club has to apply for a new one. The Executive Board, Range Master and the club attorney met with the Linn County Planning Commission on the 10th of November to go over this new application and hear testimony for and against the new conditional use permit application.



The club presented its application through a presentation explaining and showing why we need the new conditional use permit. During the presentation four discipline directors testified to the fact that they are restricted by the current permit and how the new permit would help the club. Key points that were covered included membership increase from 500 to 1500, increased demand by members and individuals within Willamette Valley communities, increased law enforcement training needs and potential draw for regional and national competitions. At the end of testimony by ARPC, anyone wanting to testify on behalf of the permit application was invited to do so. Three community members including Travis Giboney (on behalf of the ABC House work the club does), Linn County Under Sheriff Riley (need for increased law enforcement training at the club) and Jimmie from the Albany Visitors Bureau explained how the club brought almost \$400,000 worth of income into the community through special events over the last two years.

ARPC is basically asking for five basic conditions to change. They are:

1. Allow the use of the five new shooting bays on the east side of the club property
2. Allow use of the archery area on the northeast corner of the club property.
3. Standardize shooting hours to 7am-9pm every day of the week and remove the restrictions on event hours.
4. Eliminate the restriction on law enforcement training scheduling.
5. Allow future use of the club property without applying for a new conditional use permit.

A decision by the planning commission was postponed until the second Tuesday in December at the request by one of the commissioners to see testimony on sound studies from the 1994-05 hearings. The leadership of ARPC is determined to see the old restrictions lifted at the club and, at the same time, work with our neighbors with noise control issues. We will keep the membership updated when new information is available.
