As with every ARPC Gun Show, volunteers are needed. If you would like to schedule some work bond time, please contact Debi (after January 1st) at 541-928-7701 or by email at devon@peak.org using the words "March Gun Show" in the subject line. If you email, please include a contact phone number, i.e. cell phone or evening/ at home phone number.

On Friday, coverage will be needed from approximately 10:00 am to 9:00 pm, and for the two days of the show, coverage will be scheduled on Saturday from 8:00 am to 5:30 pm, and on Sunday from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm, with at least 4 people staying as late as 7:00pm. If you sign up for a shift that goes to the end of the day, 5:30 on Saturday or 5:00 on Sunday, please honor your commitment and not ask to leave early. EYE AND EAR PROTECTION

Eye and Ear Protection is mandatory on all shooting ranges at ARPC. This is true for both shooters and bystanders. A loud noise to your hearing hurts and probably won't give you any long term damage but a hit to the eye can be permanent. Regular eye glasses will work for most safety situations but wrap around shooting or safety glasses are better. Ear plugs, muffs or electronic noise canceling ear protection handles most noise situations at the range; however it may be necessary to double up ear protection with very loud firearms.



Eye protection is the most violated safety rule at ARPC. There is no room for discussion when it comes to safety; it is either the range rules way or the highway. Should you feel that a safety rule is burdensome or needs to be changed, give the Chief Range Safety Officer a call. ARPC board members are always willing to listen to constructive suggestions when it comes to range safety rules.

CMP PURCHASES

The Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) requires a document, certifying that you are a member of our club, in order to make a purchase from CMP. If you want to purchase a rifle or ammunition from CMP and need a club certification letter, send an email to the ARPC club office (rm@arpc.info) and we will email you the authorization.

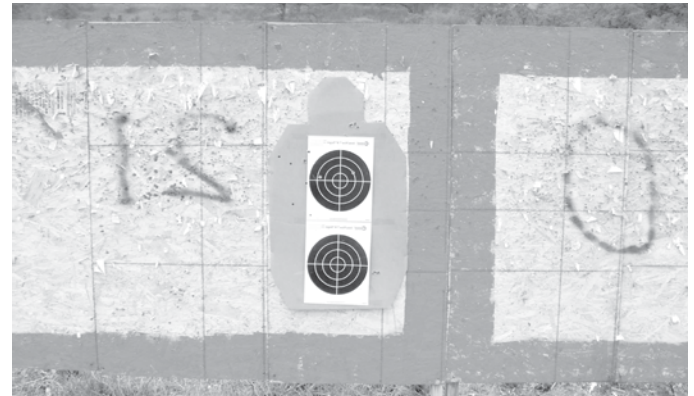
ARPC Range Officers have open access to the indoor range and the opportunity to acquire work bond hours

He says, "weekends are our busiest time at the club and it is important that a range officer is on duty to remind club members about safety. It is also important that there is someone available to answer members' and guests' questions." RANGE CLEANLINESS

When you finish shooting on the main range remove your targets and clean up your shooting area. Always leave the range in better shape than when you find it. A clean range makes it nice for the next club member and shows how much we care about this great facility. If you see abandoned targets left up by other members please remove them when you take down your targets. Several times during the week we do tours for potential new members, a clean range makes a great first impression.



North range users have the same responsibility to remove targets and sweep up when they are finished using a shooting bay. Don't leave used targets in the shooting bays. Either take them home to recycle, put them back in the target bin or get rid of them in the garbage. If you bring wood or targets other than paper/cardboard out to shoot, take them home with you. Don't leave the mess for other people to clean up. Hang brooms and dust pans up when you finish using them.

Remember to move your 'In Use' orange cones back inside the bay when you are done using the bay. 56175

RECYCLE YOUR EMPTY SHELL BOXES

Empty shell holders and boxes are now being recycled at ARPC. There are recycle bins on the main range and in every shooting bay on the range for this purpose. The ARPC junior program gets 10 cents for every complete tray and box that is recycled at the club. To date, the juniors have earned over \$38 dollars in re-

cycled boxes. Please put trays / boxes in the recycle bin and not garbage. Garbage should be put in the metal garbage cans.

AVOID INCREASED LEAD LEVELS

Wash your hands often when shooting to avoid ingesting lead into your body. Lead residue is a fact when you are around firearms, not to mention powder residue and strong chemicals. By washing your hands during shooting sessions you reduce the odds of getting these harmful metals and chemicals into your body. Wash your hands prior to using the restroom, eating or smoking cigarettes. In addition, take special precautions when reloading ammunition and cleaning your firearms at home. Practice good personal hygiene when around firearms and ammunition.



PARDON OUR CONSTRUCTION

Please pardon our construction in the main range clubhouse. We are taking some time during the winter to remove the old wood siding inside the main range clubhouse and replace it with sheetrock. The old siding is very dry and could burn up quite fast should a fire start. We will also be replacing some of the exterior doors with new doors that allow you to see someone on the opposite side of the door and upgrading the floor covering. This work should be completed by spring.



FIRST AID KITS

First Aid Kits are available on all ranges at ARPC. These kits have alcohol swabs, band aids and other first aid supplies available to shooters. Please take a moment and notice where these kits are located on the main range, shotgun range and north range. We have placed these kits so they are available without having to go through locked doors to get to them.

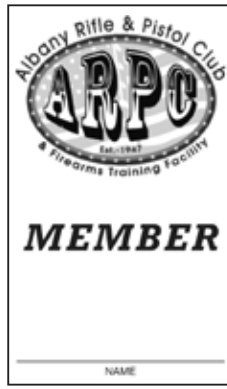


ARPC NAME BADGES

When you are at Albany Rifle and Pistol Club you must wear your name badge to identify yourself as a club member. Don't get upset if you are not wearing your name badge and

someone walks up to you and asks "are you a member of the club?" We have found non-members or guests of a member using the club without permission. If you bring guests into the club to shoot with you, sign them in and fill out a guest badge.

Wearing your name badge at the club gives other members an opportunity to introduce themselves and see your name. It is always nice to be able to ask a member a question when you know their name. Just stop in the main range classroom and pick up a new sticker for your name badge if yours needs replacing. We can even printout your name to go on your new sticker for you. The stickers are in the same box as the visitor badges.



WORK BOND CHANGES

The first Saturday morning of the month work bond party system is changing. Over the last year we have noticed an increased number of people coming out to participate in the work bond program. Don Arnold never has an idea in advance of how many people will show up for work and what kind of projects they can handle. He is now asking you to call in the week prior to work bond Saturday to let him know you are coming. NEW ENTRANCE SIGN



ARPC has upgraded the entrance sign to the club. The new sign is lighted using low voltage lights which will give visitors the opportunity to pick up membership information during low light days and provide some ambient light for the main entrance gate.

ALCOHOL AND DRUGS

ARPC has recently put up new 'No Alcohol and Drug' signs throughout the club. Some members like to use empty cans as targets on the north range. Not only is alcohol banned at ARPC but also empty alcohol containers, because they lead members to believe that someone is drinking and shooting at the range.



If you see someone drinking or acting drunk at the range, immediately call the Range Master or any member of the Executive Board. Phone numbers are posted next to the emergency phone in the main range clubhouse.

NEW JUNIOR BADGES ARE AVAILABLE

If you are a junior member at ARPC or know of one get in touch with the club office. We have new ARPC Junior Member badges and we want every ARPC Junior to wear a club badge. In addition, we will have a new ARPC Junior email newsletter available soon that will go out to all juniors who sign up for it on a monthly basis.

What is the advantage of being a Junior Member at ARPC? It costs only \$5 per year, you get into both ARPC Gun Shows free, you get into the Saddle Butte Machine Gun Shoot free, you get into Hunter's Sight In Days free and when you become 18 you can upgrade your membership to an individual membership without having to pay the \$100 initiation fee. Junior members do not need to be sponsored by an adult member to become a junior member. Note: Junior member badges do not open ARPC gates or doors. Junior members must be supervised by an adult in order to use any ARPC shooting range.

TRAP/XO REPORT

LOST AND FOUND

Call the Range Master, Mike McCarter, or any of the Executive Board and let them know what you found. Phone numbers are posted next to the emergency phone in the main range classroom. Someone on the Executive Board will make arrangements to get the firearm from you.

Just recently I sat through a weekend meeting where regional directors of the United States Practical Shooting Association met and discussed rules and regulations for shooting competitions. My thoughts wandered back to ARPC and how we (members of ARPC) handle rules and regulations during open shooting and competitions. You know that you never have to worry about someone looking over your shoulder if you are not doing anything wrong. Our Chief Instructor at ARPC, John Walker, wants to see a club range officer on duty every weekend and I think that is great. We use range officers to insure range rules are being followed and as a source of answers for club questions. Many times members



just need to be reminded to put their safety glasses on or stay behind the yellow line during a cease fire on the main range. We do have an 'Incident Report' form and I hope that we never have to write one up on a club member. 45019

Have you ever stopped and thought about what might happen should a shooting accident take place at our club? I'm sure none of us want to see anything bad take place at our club and all of us need to follow all range rules all the time.

2009 CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT UPDATE

The ARPC Executive Board and the club's attorney met with the Linn Co. Planning Commission Board for the second time on Tuesday, December 8th to go over information regarding sound testing that occurred in 1994 and 1995. At this hearing the board also discussed recently-submitted documents that reflected an agreement between ARPC and interested neighbors on noise control. All parties are in agreement with a new proposed conditional use agreement. The Linn Co. planning department is currently working on the final document which will be presented at the next Linn Co. Planning hearing on January 12, 2010. Should this document get approval from ARPC, our neighbors, and the Planning Commission, the club will have a much clearer and less restrictive permit to work under. Watch for upcoming news in February's newsletter about the new conditional use permit.



The ARPC Executive Board has been working on this process for over two years and wants to thank everyone who has been involved for their patience. With the new conditional use permit we will be able to move forward with many of our work projects and upgrade the club to make it more usable for its members.
