## SAFETY RULES TO REMEMBER

1. Every gun is ALWAYS loaded. No matter how many times you check a gun to see if it is loaded or watch someone else check it, you must ALWAYS check to make sure it is unloaded when you touch a gun.
2. NEVER put your finger on the trigger until your sights are on the target. Handling a gun with your finger on the trigger is asking for trouble. Your finger goes outside the trigger guard until your sights are on the target and you are ready to shoot.
3. NEVER point your firearm at anything you are not willing to destroy. This goes for fruit, flower, steel, wood, paper, clay, animal or human and it doesn't matter if you think the firearm is unloaded. Remember rule #1.
4. ALWAYS be aware of the environment surrounding your target. It may look like there is a good backstop; however, bullets travel long distances and can ricochet off into directions you would never think possible.
5. ALWAYS wear your safety gear around firearms. It doesn't matter if someone else is shooting, guns can blow up and shrapnel can fly around when bullets hit hard objects. You may not have a problem but someone across the range might.

## MUZZLE UP

"Muzzle Up" is a new safety slogan that you will hear more and more about. When moving long guns around on the range it is important to carry uncased guns with the muzzle up. Remember "Every Gun is Always Loaded" and, no, we don't want a round accidentally going off in any direction, but we also don't point guns at other people. If you are carrying an uncased rifle or shotgun around on any ARPC range please keep the "Muzzle Up" and not pointed in someone's direction.



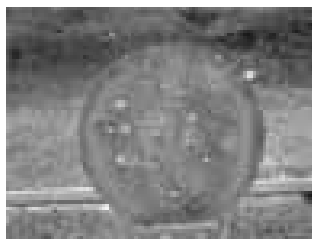

## STEEL PLATE RACKS

The steel plate racks located on the south end of the main range and bay 5 on the north range are for handgun use only. DO NOT use rifles of any caliber on the plate racks. Rifle ammunition can damage the plates on the rack. Yes, .22 caliber ammunition will not hurt the plates but once a person sees someone shooting a rifle on a plate rack they assume that any rifle can be shot on the plates. DO NOT use rifles on the plate racks.



**SAFETY ISSUE**, shooting plates on the plate rack can be hazardous to your health! Shooting metal targets can create splatter and flying bullet fragments. Eye protection is always required when shooting on any range. This includes 'watchers', and is particularly important when shooting at steel targets. Always maintain a safe distance of at least 10 yards when shooting at steel.

## WATCH FOR YOUR GATE CARD NUMBER

Your gate card has a number printed on it. Each month we include three club member gate card numbers imbedded in newsletter articles. If you find your number before the

## RANGE MASTER REPORT

Throughout the month and between newsletters, small issues develop of which club members need to be aware but which are not earth shaking. Here is a short list. First, please read your newsletter each month and take a look at the club website before



coming out to the club to shoot. Bays 8 thru 12 are open for member use; however, you cannot park at the bays. You can drive up to the bay, off-load your gear and then park your vehicle at the turnaround near Bay 7.

Second, the new target stands for the north range have arrived and we will soon have extra sticks available at the main range clubhouse Pro Shop to purchase. These stands take regular 1x2" sticks and you can bring some instead of buying them at the Pro Shop. Our sticks will sell for 50 cents a piece. There will be six stands per bay and if you take some out of one bay then please return them. The stands will be hanging on the wall next to the broom and dust pan in each of the covered bays so please hang them back up when you are finished with them. Target stands will be stacked up on one side of each bay in Bays 8 thru 12. We have painted the club stands yellow and will have new blue stands available thru the Pro Shop if you want to purchase your own.

Third, all club members share range space with other club members. The exception to this is for rented range space and discipline events. We share range space in every open shooting bay on the north and east bays. Do not lock the doors when using one of the covered bays.

Fourth, always leave the range, where you are shooting, in better shape than when you found it. If you shoot .22 caliber firearms on a range then sweep up your brass. Not only does this leave a mess but stepping on .22 brass can be dangerous. Take home any target you bring to the range, don't leave it for the club to throw away.

We want to thank all of our club members who take the extra time to make our club one of the best in the West. ARPC is more than just a place to shoot, it is a great group of people who enjoy the sport of shooting and who like firearms.

## NORTH RANGE TARGET STANDS



Over the next few months the club will be changing the style of target stands members use on the north range. The new stands will require using two 4' long 1x2" pieces of wood to attach targets to (see the picture). The stands will be available in each bay but members will need to bring in their own 1x2's to make the stands work. 1x2's will be available for sale in the club's Pro Shop or they can be purchased at any lumber supplier like Home Depot. Once purchased they are your sticks, so keep them with your shooting gear and bring them to the range with you each time you shoot.

The metal stands that have been used in the past on the north range have been shot to pieces. We want to give the benefit of the doubt that most of our members are good shots, but some members like to hang things on the stands or place plastic bottles on the target holders with little thought to bullet damage to the stand behind their target. If you, the member, own the target sticks behind the targets then you can shoot the stick to pieces if you want and the rest of the club members don't have to pay for it. .

## MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL - APRIL 1<sup>ST</sup>

All individual, family and junior memberships are up for renewal on the first of April each year. Those members who do not renew by the end of April will have their gate cards turned off and can be reactivated without paying initiation fees when they pay their full dues for the year. Members delinquent for one year must start the membership process all over to become an active member. The renewal application is included in this newsletter.
