## Safety Issue



We are still noticing an issue with the electronic safety system on the main range. Club members are initiating the 'Cease-Fire' buzzer system and walking down range without communicating with other shooters on the main range. A "Cease-Fire" is **NOT** initiated until all shooters have unloaded guns and ready to go to a "Cease-Fire". Pushing the button and going down range without communicating with the rest of the shooters can put an individual in front of a loaded firearm.

Make sure that everyone on the main range is ready to go to a 'Cease-Fire' before hitting the button.

## **Shotgun Shell Reloading Class**

Reloads are cheaper than factory loads, so you can shoot more for the same amount of money. If you have just reached the point where you have decided to take the plunge and begin reloading your own shotgun shells, right now it probably seems a complicated and difficult process. However, with only a little practical experience you will discover that reloading is simple. Care and attention to detail are required to produce safe, reliable, reduced-cost ammunition that compares to the expensive store-bought ammo. The process has only a few steps and is basically repetitive.

Don Arnold is conducting this class on Saturday, August 27, 2011 in the shotgun / trap building. The class will take students through all parts of the reloading of shotgun shells including testing and function so don't forget your safety gear. Class starts at 9am and is scheduled to run until noon, longer if needed.

This class includes a Mec 600 Jr. Mark 5 single stage reloading press, shot, powder, 100 primers, 500 wads and 100 hulls. The cost of the class including all of these supplies is \$275. When the class is over you will have the knowledge and the equipment to reload shotgun shells for years to come.

## **Women Only Pistol Class**



The next 'Basic Pistol for Women 101' class is August 27<sup>th</sup>, 3-6PM.

Basic Pistol for Women 101 is an introductory class that covers safety, basic handgun fundamentals and handgun shooting techniques. This class is open to women only, sorry no husbands, boyfriends, children or pets. You must call in to pre-register, bring your own firearm, holster, belt, safety glasses, ear protection and 100 rounds of ammunition. Any caliber or type of handgun is allowed and holsters must cover the trigger. Please be prepared for any type of weather and bring plenty of snacks and water. Class fee is \$25 for club members and \$30 for non-club members.

Classes are limited to the first 12 participants and fill up quickly. Please call the ARPC club office (541-491-3755) to register or ask questions.

## Range Rule Review



It has come to our attention over the last couple of months that some club members feel that it is against ARPC range rules to carry a pistol, handgun or revolver on your person in a holster while on the range. There is no club rule that prevents this and in fact range rules state:

Always keep the firearm unloaded until ready to shoot; ARPC is a "cold" range. All firearms must be unloaded except during use, with the following exceptions:

1. Law enforcement officers may carry loaded firearms to the extent required by their organizational written procedures; however, such firearms must be properly holstered or secured and may not be handled except in accordance with their written procedures.
2. Concealed firearms may be carried so long as they are neither visible nor apparent. Firearms carried under this provision may not be handled or if used on the range they must be handled according to standard range rules.
3. Loaded firearms may be holstered in order to practice drawing from a holster.

We hope this clarifies club rules about holstered firearms on club property. It is okay to carry an unloaded handgun (openly) in a holster, it is okay to carry a loaded gun concealed, however when using a concealed - loaded handgun it falls under normal range rules.

## Work Bond

ARPC needs workers/volunteers during the week for special projects and volunteers during the week for range cleanup.

If you want to help at the club and get work bond hours in against your renewal fees just give the office a call (541-491-3755) to volunteer. It is important that you call ahead because that gives the staff time to prepare supplies or special needs for the job. Remember, the best time to volunteer is when the weather is good.

Don't wait until the last minute prior to renewal to get your hours in, there might not be that much work available in the rain.

Work bond hours are not guaranteed; when you want to do the work may not be the time it needs to get done. We will continue to remind you not to wait until the last minute. Remember to call Don Arnold at 541-619-3238 if you want to work at our regularly scheduled Saturday work bond.



## Introduction to Basic Pistol Class

Are you frustrated with your handgun shooting and can't figure out why you can't hit the target

consistently? Would you like to learn to shoot your handgun better?

This class teaches you the basics behind handgun shooting. Shooting any gun is basic geometry, "keep the sights lined up while the gun goes bang", and it is just that simple. However, when talking about handguns there are many variables that affect the geometry.

The Basic Pistol Class takes place on Sunday, August 28<sup>th</sup> from 3-6PM. This class covers handgun basics such as safety, handling, selection, grip, stance, sight alignment, trigger press and follow through.

Give Mike McCarter (541-619-0038) a call to register for the class as it is limited to 12 people. Cost for the class is \$25 for ARPC club members and \$30 for non-members. Attendees need to bring their own handgun, holster (one that covers the trigger), strong belt, 100 rounds of ammunition and safety gear. Make sure you dress for the weather. ## Pro Shop Update

Pro Shop items change weekly with new merchandise coming in all the time. We continue to focus on items not normally available at our regional retail stores. New items that have just arrived include: 6" wooden stick Q-tips, heavy duty nitrile (powdered) gloves, jell-tip ear plugs, 3M safety glasses with metal frames, white target tape to tape those holes in paper plate targets, new 2011 Saddle Butte Machine Gun Shoot tee shirts, 22 caliber target ammunition and 12 gauge shotgun Acu-Trac (range approved) tracer components to help you shoot those birds a bit better.
