2013 ARPC Annual Meeting

Dirty Laundry

Issues take place at ARPC and most of the time we don't talk about them, we just fix them. When the issue is safety it must be shared with the membership.



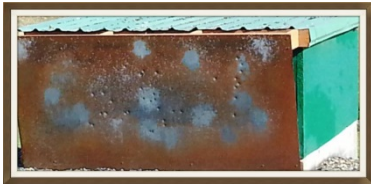
Main Range Cease-fires:

Once everyone agrees to a cease-fire on the main range, always make sure the safety area (between the yellow line and the red muzzle line) is clear of all shooters **before** pushing the button and going downrange. If you push the cease-fire button and immediately go down range you could put yourself in front of someone handling a firearm. Giving the shooters time to clear the safety area around the shooting benches helps eliminate this potential problem. Always look both left and right before crossing the red muzzle line and going downrange.

Holes in north and east range roofs:

Rule #1 with firearms, "Every gun is always loaded".

Rule #2, "Never put your finger on the trigger until your sights are on the target". We know that Rule #2 is not always being followed because we have found a few holes in north and east range shooting bay metal roofs. Do not put your finger on the trigger until your sights are on the target.



Shotgun backstop:

This is not a target. The Shotgun Range is for shotguns only with the exception of law enforcement rifle training.

Traffic Safety:

Be very careful when you leave the range. Watch for cross traffic on Saddle Butte Rd. and Boston Mill Rd. Leave your shooting brain at the range and concentrate on your driving. Do not speed anywhere but particularly on Seven Mile Lane. Linn County officers like to park at the Glaser Seed Warehouse halfway to Highway 34 (likely they will move to another location following this publication).

Gun Theft

Are you afraid that someone is going to steal your guns? Does the thought make you sick to your stomach? Have you made a list of your guns by make, model and serial number? Did you put this list in a safe place (not your gun safe) where it can't be destroyed? If you can't give the police the make, model and serial number of your stolen gun(s) then it is likely that you will never get it or them back. Don't wait, make a list of them now and should you have a gun stolen, report it to the police as well as the Pro Shop. 19347 We'll look out for it and might be able to help you recover it.
