SHOTGUN AND MAIN RANGES ARE BACK IN ACTION!

THE DIRT MOVING IS FINALLY FINISHED!

Thank you for your patience during our west side improvement project. It came in on budget but we lost time due to 10 more days of impact hammer use than was originally predicted. Our contractor, Pepper Construction,

absorbed those costs! Pepper Construction did a wonderful job and we are so thankful to them for it. As with any project, there are the incidentals that can now be completed; finishing the 200 yard targets on the Main Range, gravel placement, walkway areas, etc. We'll try to keep the closures to a bare minimum during working hours while we tie up these loose ends.

Now that we are back in action, please remember the Main Range rules. In particular:

1. All firearms shall be uncased and cased at the firing line.
2. If your firearm is uncased long guns must be brought onto the range with the muzzle up, pistols muzzle down and only when the range is HOT.
3. Please make sure all other shooters are aware of a cease fire prior to activating the buzzer and that everyone is behind the yellow line.
4. Please remove your targets when you are finished - even if they are unused. The wind and rain make a mess of them.

We are making every effort to provide a safe and professional range to use. It's your range, leave it nicer than you found it! Again we thank you for your patience. Please come by and take a look...it looks great!

Please take the time to attend. It's your club. Let your voice be heard!

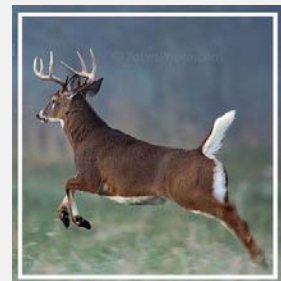
Executive Board Openings

Shotgun Patterning Board

The Shotgun Range now has a patterning board that is up and in use. **Please NO buckshot or slugs!** Shot under size #6 is permissible to shoot from 30 yards; greater than #6 from 40 yards only. Yardage markers are posted.

To use:

1. Locate grease tub and roller inside tub
2. Roll grease on the west side of patterning board
3. Shoot at board from appropriate distance according to size of shot
4. Inspect your pattern
5. If necessary, re-roll the board and try again
