

Approved Targets

We now have our approved target list available for your viewing pleasure. These lists are range specific so please check the list for the range you are shooting on.

Please pick up and take home all of your used targets. We do have a cardboard recycling bin between Bays 2 and 3 in which you may place your used cardboard targets.

MAIN RANGE TARGETS

- Paper and cardboard must be attached to the target boards or chicken wire with member supplied staples or ARPC supplied clothes pins
- Clay pigeons must be attached to the target boards or chicken wire with ARPC supplied clothes pins
- Steel targets brought by the member attached to the target boards
- ARPC supplied and maintained steel targets are the only targets approved as free-standing
- Do not shoot target frames, rocks or any other target not approved for use.

SHOTGUN RANGE TARGETS

Clay Pigeons or the ARPC supplied steel pattern board only

NORTH AND EAST RANGE - EXCEPT BAYS 4 & 5

Paper, cardboard, clay pigeons, firearm approved steel, golf balls, tennis balls, clean cans, reactive
targets (plastic ground bouncing targets) and clean plastic bottles/jugs –placed no higher than six feet
above the bay floor.

BAYS 4 & 5

ARPC supplied and maintained steel targets only

INDOOR RANGE

Paper and cardboard only

ARCHERY RANGES

Target tipped arrows only

Steel Targets at ARPC

Many ranges do not allow their members to bring in steel targets for various reasons that include noise and safety issues. Our Conditional Use Permit allows steel as long as it is not a "gong style" target that produces a ringing sound.

ARPC believes steel is a valuable target and can be used safely and legally if a few simple rules are followed. Listed below are the rules regarding distances and usage of steel targets.

MINIMUM DISTANCES MAIN RANGE

All steel targets, except for ARPC supplied steel, must be hung on the front of one of the provided target boards only. This will absorb the impact and produce a more pleasing sound. The chicken wire is not an approved backing for steel targets.

- Shotgun slugs 50 yards
- Rifles 100 yards

NORTH AND EAST BAYS EXCEPT 4 AND 5

- Pistol caliber handguns and pistol caliber carbines 12 yards
- Shotgun slugs allowed in Bay 12 only 50 yards
- No rifle engagement on steel allowed in bays

BAYS 4 AND 5

- Pistol caliber handguns only
- ARPC supplied steel targets only

SHOTGUN AND INDOOR RANGES

No steel allowed except ARPC patterning board


