### Pacific Coast Challenge GSSF Match

ARPC will once again host the Pacific Coast Challenge GSSF Match on July 29th and 30th. This is a great match to show your prowess with your plastic gun! You must join GSSF to compete. There is a \$35 charge to join as an individual. There are also family memberships. Visit [www.gssfonline.com](http://www.gssfonline.com) to join.

Participants can register for 20 categories based on their Glock pistols, qualifications, sex and age. They may sign up for as many categories as they have pistols to use. Participants can win certificates for Glock Pistols and other Glock swag through performance as well as random drawings!

Participants do not draw from the holster or move during the course of fire so it is an easy match to shoot and doesn't require any special equipment.

Five to ten volunteers are needed for setup on Friday. Please contact Brian, our Range Manager, at 541-491-3755 if you would like to volunteer.

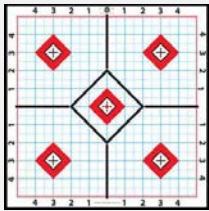
## Updated New Member Orientation

ARPC has updated New Member Orientation. All our new members have demonstrated safe gun handling skills and their comprehension of our range rules prior to receiving their gate cards. You can distinguish these members by the green circle and white check mark on their gate card. We instituted this program to increase the level of safety and range rule compliance at our range. We welcome any current member to sign up for a refresher orientation. You will receive the same awesome green circle on your gate card after completing the class. Be the first one in your shooting group to proudly wear the green circle of safety!



## Shotgun Hulls Left Behind

These shotgun hulls and many like them are found weekly left in many of our bays. It seems that some people do not consider them garbage to be collected and thrown away or saved and reloaded for another time. Orientation stresses that we leave every range in better shape than we found it. It gives all of us a sense of pride to see that every range owner and their guests are keeping the ranges clean. Remember that this is your range. Time spent cleaning these ranges takes valuable maintenance resources that can be used in more constructive ways.



## Approved Targets - One More Time

We now have our approved target list available for your viewing pleasure. These lists are range specific so please check the list for the range you are shooting on.

Please pick up and take home all of your used targets. We do have a cardboard recycling bin between Bays 2 and 3 in which you may place your used cardboard targets.

### MAIN RANGE TARGETS

- Paper and cardboard – must be attached to the target boards or chicken wire with member supplied staples or ARPC supplied clothes pins
- Clay pigeons – must be attached to the target boards or chicken wire with ARPC supplied clothes pins
- Steel targets brought by the member - attached to the target boards
- ARPC supplied and maintained steel targets are the only targets approved as free-standing
- Do not shoot target frames, rocks or any other target not approved for use.

### SHOTGUN RANGE TARGETS

- Clay Pigeons or the ARPC supplied steel pattern board only

### NORTH AND EAST RANGE - EXCEPT BAYS 4 & 5

- Paper, cardboard, clay pigeons, firearm approved steel, golf balls, tennis balls, clean cans, reactive targets (plastic ground bouncing targets) and clean plastic bottles/jugs –placed no higher than six feet above the bay floor.

### BAYS 4 & 5

- ARPC supplied and maintained steel targets only

## INDOOR RANGE

- Paper and cardboard only

## ARCHERY RANGES

- Target tipped arrows only



### Range Rule #16 - Reminder

Unopened full soda pop cans and plastic bottles filled with soda are NOT on the approved target list. Soda pop falls under ALL RANGES RULE # 16 “targets that create a mess”. You may not think pop makes a mess but it does. It also attracts mice, rats and bees. 56187 You are welcome to use empty, clean soda pop cans and plastic jugs as long as you take them home with you when done shooting.

### Bright Green Bay Cones?

Bay use is sometimes difficult to find as the weather warms up and it is not possible for members to reserve a bay. We encourage sharing of bays at ARPC. Every member is familiar with the orange cones - you place them outside of the bay that you are using to alert other members that it is in use and there is live firing inside.

We have added bright green cones to the bays. Please place these outside of the bay if you'd like to share with your fellow members. You'll find that you meet a lot of wonderful people.



### Steel Targets at ARPC - One More Time



Many ranges do not allow their members to bring in steel targets for various reasons that include noise and safety issues. Our Conditional Use Permit allows steel as long as it is not a “gong style” target that produces a ringing sound.

ARPC believes steel is a valuable target and can be used safely and legally if a few simple rules are followed. Listed below are the rules regarding distances and usage of steel targets.

#### MINIMUM DISTANCES MAIN RANGE

All steel targets, except for ARPC supplied steel, must be hung on the front of one of the provided target boards only. This will absorb the impact and produce a more pleasing sound. The chicken wire is not an approved backing for steel targets.

- Shotgun slugs - 50 yards
- Rifles - 100 yards

## NORTH AND EAST BAYS EXCEPT 4 AND 5

- Pistol caliber handguns and pistol caliber carbines - 12 yards
- Shotgun slugs – allowed in Bay 12 only - 50 yards
- No rifle engagement on steel allowed in bays

## BAYS 4 AND 5

- Pistol caliber handguns only
- ARPC supplied steel targets only

## SHOTGUN AND INDOOR RANGES

- No steel allowed except ARPC patterning board

## Main Range Cease Fire Procedure



**If you see a dangerous or emergency condition- In a loud and clear voice say “CEASE FIRE” repeatedly and push the “cold range” button. Explain the situation to members and guests and agree on how to proceed. Solve the condition before resuming normal operations.**

### NORMAL RANGE PROCEDURES

1. To go down range of the red firing line the range must be in a “cold” condition:
  - a. Physically talk with all persons on the firing line to make sure they are ready for a “cold range” condition. Make sure to look for prone shooters who may not be readily visible, then;
  - b. Walk both directions along the firing line to make sure all firearms are either cased or empty, with actions open, and everyone is back behind the yellow line and not handling firearms.
  - c. **YOU** are solely responsible for conditions a and b **BEFORE** continuing. In a loud and clear voice say “Going Cold”, check left and right for compliance one more time, then press the top button. This engages the audible and visible “Cold Range” status indicators and must be on before anyone goes downrange or forward of the red firing line.
  - d. All persons shall cross the firing line through the green striped zones only.
  - e. If anyone remains behind the firing line during a “cold range” condition, they must stay behind the yellow line and not handle any uncased firearms.

f. Before turning off the "cold range" indicators make sure everyone is behind the yellow line and communicate the firing line is going "HOT". Be certain that no one is down range, behind the target frames or on the walkways when terminating a "cold range" condition. In a loud and clear voice say "Going Hot", then push the bottom button. Note, always use the buzzer-strobe system to indicate a "cold range" even if you are by yourself. A verbal "cold range" can be used in case of an emergency or power outage.

## Eye Protection is VITAL

Eye protection is REQUIRED at all times when on ARPC property. Pictured is a black eye as a result of an impact above the eyebrow (you can see a very small cut). This object hit the safety glasses first and deflected up to the eyebrow with a considerable amount of force; enough to blacken our member's eye. Imagine how terrible this impact would have been if he had not been wearing eye protection. Be safe out there people!

What is this you ask? Many bays have portable shooting tables where you can place your bags or use them for additional shooting areas on the firing line.
