You've got it all. The drive to the range goes well and the weather is perfect. You swipe your card at the gate and go down the North Range Road looking for an open bay. Wow that was easy! There's nary a soul in sight, maybe because it's 6pm and the dinner hour. You unload your car and realize...I FORGOT MY STICKS! Oh no! The office is closed and how am I going to set up my targets with just clips and a stand?! Maybe I'll just go home.

Heck no, don't do that! ARPC has you covered. Adjacent to the used target kiosk between Bays 2 and 3, you will not find a barrel with loaner sticks and a few clips. Need a stick or two? Use them and return them. Have too many sticks left over? Put them in the barrel for your fellow members. They'll thank you for it!





All Guns Are Always Loaded

You may find this difficult to believe but many people disagree with this rule. We live in a society where everything seems to be in question. So, what does this rule really mean?

Yes, we want to treat all guns like they're always loaded but we must acknowledge that some really aren't loaded. When we're cleaning them, they're stripped down, in pieces and aren't loaded nor capable of firing a round. During dry fire exercises, they are not loaded.

You may disagree with the wording of the rule, but the intent is to provide safety. Please take a second to view the gun in the picture. Are you able to tell if it's loaded by looking at it? Your husband, wife, or firearm instructor, hand you a gun and tell you that it is not loaded. Maybe they have more knowledge than you and you feel uncomfortable checking the gun for yourself. Do you believe them and take them at their word that the gun is unloaded? Absolutely not! Accidents happen. We're human.

We preserve this rule by visually and manually inspecting any gun we handle.

Don't ever take control of a firearm until you have physically verified for yourself that it is not loaded. A casual attitude towards firearms can prove to be deadly.

LEARNING ABOUT GUNS

Are you aware that many gun owners are non-shooters? These are the people that have either purchased or inherited a gun and know nothing about it. They may have a firearm for protection, may or may not have their concealed handgun license, but lack confidence and are afraid that they may be critiqued by more experienced shooters. Many are unsure who to talk to regarding where to shoot, gun maintenance, how to shoot or how to safely and legally transport it. Some feel they will be ridiculed for not knowing how to safely handle their firearm, load it and hit the target perfectly.

Why not encourage people to consider the ARPC Basic Handgun Class on the second Sunday of the month? Instruction focuses on safety rules, storage, transportation, ammunition, sight picture, common shooting errors, cleaning and includes live fire practice. It is open to the public and information is located on the ARPC calendar.

We also provide additional classes that are targeted at just ladies. Your family may have shaped you into the awesome person that you are today, but they can't teach you anything because, frankly, we don't listen to family. Try an experienced instructor and you'll see the fun in learning about your firearm.



Hunter Sight-In Days September 8, 9, 15 & 16, 2018

Hunting season is rapidly approaching! Time to break out your favorite rifles and get them ready for the various seasons. ARPC is here to help. The second and third weekend in September, ARPC will offer structured rifle sighting assistance on our Main Range. Experienced volunteers will assist members and non-members adjust their sights to make the perfect shot. This service is free of charge to ARPC members and \$5 per rifle for non-members. This community service is always appreciated by everyone who attends.

The logistics for both weekends is as follows:

The Main Range will be controlled by HSID staff from 8:00 AM until approximately 4:30 PM. The Main Range will be closed from 8:00 AM until 9:00 AM for setup. HSID staff will use the north half of the Main Range. At 9:00 AM our volunteers will open shooting on the Main Range. The south half of the range will open for regular member use at this time; targets will be provided at this south end on the 100-yard line for our members. Cease fire calls will be under the control of HSID staff only and will be called at least every two hours for target replacement. 7631 At approximately 4:00 PM, HSID staff will call a cease fire and take down their target boards. The Main

Range will then return to normal operating procedures for the remainder of each day.

As ARPC members, you will experience some inconveniences during these weekends. Please be courteous and patient. This is not only a community service but also a fundraiser. We will try to maintain normal shooting as much as possible.
