THIS VETERANS DAY MARKS THE 100th ANNIVERSARY OF THE END OF WORLD WAR 1 - NOVEMBER 11, 2018

Veterans Day, formerly known as Armistice Day, was originally set as a U.S. legal holiday to honor the end of World War I. At 5 a.m. - the 11th hour on the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918 -

Germany, bereft of manpower and supplies and faced with imminent invasion, signed an armistice agreement with the Allies in a railroad car outside Compiègne, France. The First World War left nine million soldiers dead and 21 million wounded, with Germany, Russia, Austria-Hungary, France, and Great Britain each losing nearly a million or more lives. In addition, at least five million civilians died from disease, starvation, or exposure.

In legislation that was passed in 1938, November 11 was "dedicated to the cause of world peace and to be hereafter celebrated and known as 'Armistice Day.'" As such, this new legal holiday honored World War I veterans. In 1954, after having been through both World War II and the Korean War, the 83rd U.S. Congress -- at the urging of the veteran's service organizations -- amended the Act of 1938 by striking out the word "Armistice" and inserting the word "Veterans."

With the approval of this legislation on June 1, 1954, November 11 became a day to honor ALL American veterans, both living and dead. In fact, Veterans Day is largely intended to thank LIVING veterans for dedicated and loyal service to our country. Veterans Day of each year is the day that we ensure veterans know that we deeply appreciate their service and the sacrifices they have made in their lives to keep our country free.

Targets on Berms

Many of our members and guests enjoy shooting items on the berms. It's fun to shoot the clay pigeons and watch them break apart, then shoot the tiny pieces that are left. This is a reminder for anyone who is placing clay pigeons or other approved targets on the berms.



Berm Usage Rules:

Targets may not exceed six feet (6') up the berm from ground level.

If you are six feet (6') tall, you may only toss the targets onto the berms as high as your head.

Do not climb the berms.

Non-biodegradable targets, like golf balls, need to be removed by the shooters. Do not climb the berms to retrieve targets for any reason.

Please remember to leave the shooting areas in better shape than you found them. If you have any questions regarding any rules, please ask our Range Manager for clarification.
