New Senate Bills on The Horizon

Dear Members and Readers,

Over the years, the Oregon Legislature has attacked our gun rights. However, never in our state history have they been more at risk than right now. You have likely heard of the bizarre [SB 501](#).

- 1 - Requires you to secure a permit from your County Sheriff before purchasing or receiving a firearm
- 2 - Requires gun owner to secure firearm with trigger lock or in locked container
- 3 - Prohibits possession of magazine with capacity to hold more than five rounds of ammunition
- 4 - Prohibits transfer of firearm until the latter of 14 days (waiting period) and an approved background check
- 5 - Prohibits any person receiving more than 20 rounds of ammunition in any 30-day period

These above points are just highlights but do have other stipulations associated with them. Please read the entire bill for ALL of the specifics. This bill is only one of many being proposed. Shooting Range Liability - Oregon Senate Bill 5

Another proposed bill, [Oregon SB 5](#), claims to be about holding ranges liable for bullets leaving their ranges. I doubt anyone would think that wasn't

already the case. However, this bill designates that Counties are also liable.

As you may or may not know, ARPC has a Linn County Conditional Use Permit.

We must apply to and obtain permission from Linn County to add any additional shooting bays or improvements to our range. What County would issue an update to a Conditional Use or Building Permit if they could be held responsible for an accident? This proposed bill has potentially devastating effects for the future of ARPC. Currently only the State can legislate gun ranges. This bill will share that authority with the Counties. Furthermore, if anyone reports a "dangerous condition" (this term has yet to be defined) to the County; the County must take action or be held liable as well.

This opens Pandora's Box for the County to legislate and regulate however they see fit. Please contact your State AND County Representatives to voice your concerns.

Are You Placing Targets on The Berms?

Placing or tossing targets on the berms is perfectly acceptable as long as they are no higher than six feet above the ground.

Stay on the floor of the bay. We are consistently finding targets higher than allowed, sometimes even paper plates stapled to the trees above the berms and water bottles on the tree line! This is a HUGE SAFETY ISSUE and range violation. If you intend to continue enjoying your ARPC membership, please discontinue this dangerous activity.



Range Brass and New Barrels

The long-awaited arrival of range brass barrels is finally here! Bays 8-12 have now been outfitted with 55-gallon brass barrels. Similar barrels are found in all shooting areas and are intended for your range brass and dud rounds. 12485 Please remember to pick up your brass and always leave the range in better shape than you found it. And remember that you are welcome to pick up other people's brass for your own uses. It's the polite thing to do and your fellow members will thank you for it.

Hunting the Pests of the Pivots This Spring?

For those of us that enjoy helping out our friendly alfalfa growers, April and May cannot come soon enough. Sage rats, squeaks, whistle pigs, pot-guts and ground squirrels, whatever your preferred name for them, decimate alfalfa crops in Oregon, California, Idaho, Utah and Washington. They can eat 14.5 pounds of alfalfa in a four-month period causing up to 45% loss of crop according to the OSU Extension Service. Their burrows cause water loss, weaken dams and increase erosion. It's a team effort to eradicate these buggers. Everyone has their favorite rifle of choice with the .17 HMR, .22LR, .204 Ruger and .223 Remington with high-magnifying scopes topping the lists. Make sure you follow all of the hunting rules of your chosen grounds, obtain permission and treat the landowner's property with respect while you're there. You'll have a place to shoot for years to come.
