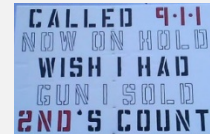

Oregon Legislature Anti-Gun Bills



It was a beautiful spring day at the Capitol on Saturday, March 23rd. Thousands of concerned yet calm, considerate Oregonians listened to a series of State Politicians and other speakers in support of Second Amendment Rights. Not to mention a great live band. Radian Weapons and Noveske were the main sponsors and organizers of this well-run event. 12208 Radian is selling "Support the 2nd" AR-15 charging handles. They are great looking handles and the proceeds go to help cover the costs.

I saw quite a few ARPC members and feel we were well represented. It was uplifting to see the interaction between Law Enforcement and all of the attendees. Smiles and kind exchanges were the norm. This is in stark contrast to the typical events I see on the news. I am proud to be a part of this group.

This Event was a great first start! How can we keep this momentum going? As several speakers mentioned, personally contact your Legislators. Mass emails do not get the attention that a personal phone call, letter or email receives. Here is a link to help locate your representatives.

PLEASE take the time to contact your House and Senate representatives. Be respectful but assertive in your stance on current legislation and the general attacks on the Second Amendment. Watch for political events, attend, and speak when the floor is opened. For instance, four legislators from the mid-valley will co-host a town hall at 1 to 3 p.m. Saturday, March 30, in the Russell Tripp Performance Center at Linn-Benton Community College, 6500 Pacific Blvd. SW, in Albany. On hand will be Reps. Shelly Boshart Davis (District 15), Mike Nearman (District 23) and Marty Wilde (District 11), and Sen. Sara Gelser (District 8). They will be fielding questions from the public and giving a legislative update. If we do not stop the cacophony of rhetoric coming from the Anti's, we will lose the legislative battle. Today we have an imperfect but workable system. Let's work together to keep it from getting any worse.

Long Range Update

As ARPC is member-owned, we will never enter into a financial agreement that would indebt our membership. We only proceed with a project when funds are available.

As this project started to come to fruition, we realized that it would cost upwards of \$1.5M. That, in itself, was a bitter pill to swallow. However, it was coupled by the realization that the land that was to be used for this project has a gas pipeline easement. When asked if we would be able to place a dirt bullet retention berm over it, the owners were quick to use the word "litigate".

Therefore, though we have had many modifications trying to make this project work, it is with heavy heart that we are forced to abandon the 300, 600 and 1,000-yard rifle ranges. Immediate Range Rule Changes - Bays 7 & 8

Dear Members and Guests,

This email is to inform you of immediate Range Rule changes regarding Bays 7 & 8. There has been an uptick in reports of debris leaving these Bays and landing in other shooting areas, trees, parking lots, etc. The Executive Board and staff are working on long term solutions to this issue. In the interim, we have devised some rules to drastically reduce the likelihood of this occurring.

The new rules regarding Bays 7 & 8 only are:

No steel targets

No ground targets

Bullets must not strike the gravel

All bullets must strike the REAR BERM above the gravel and no higher than 6' measured from the Bay floor

Place your targets within 10 feet (3 big steps) of the rear berm

EXCEPTION: Disciplines may place non-steel targets along the side berms as long as all projectiles strike the berm below 6 feet and above the gravel.

Bump Stock Destruction Date is Here

The Department of Justice is amending the regulations of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (ATF) to clarify that bump-stock-type devices-meaning "bump fire" stocks, slide-fire devices, and devices with certain similar characteristics-are "machineguns" as defined by the National Firearms Act of 1934 and the Gun Control Act of 1968 because such devices allow a shooter of a semiautomatic firearm to initiate a continuous firing cycle with a single pull of the trigger.



The summary says a bump stock allows the trigger of a semiautomatic firearm to reset between the firing of each round but describes the bump stock-equipped "semiautomatic firearm" as "self-acting or self-regulating," and therefore a "machinegun."

According to the Department of Justice's summary, there will be no grandfathering of pre-owned bump stocks; all bump stocks must be

destroyed or handed over to the ATF by March 21, 2019. 9160 Those who refuse could face federal 'machinegun' charges that carry up to 10 years in prison and \$250,000 in fines for each violation.

In light of this law, ARPC no longer allows bump stocks on our property.
