Oregon Legislature Anti-Gun Bills Senate Bill 978



"On April 9th, the Oregon state Senate Judiciary Committee voted to approve Senate Bill 978 with the -5 Amendment. This legislation is an omnibus gun control package that, among other things, would require firearms be kept unavailable for self-defense and would also expand gun free zones where law-abiding individuals would be left defenseless. It will now go to the Senate floor for further consideration. Please contact your state Senator and urge them to OPPOSE SB 978. ["Take Action"](#) to contact your state Senator.

Senate Bill 978-5 as passed out of committee would:

- Legalize age discrimination for firearm dealers to allow them to refuse service to young adults for no reason other than being under the age of 21.
- Impose a one-size-fits-all government solution for firearm storage and require them to be made unavailable for self-defense.
- Further victimize gun owners who have suffered a loss or theft of their property with criminal penalties if they fail to follow certain requirements when reporting them, including holding the gun owner strictly liable for the future illegal acts committed by criminals using the stolen firearm.
- End the centuries old practice of home manufacturing firearms for lawful, personal use.
- Allow local governments to create "gun-free zones" in public buildings, colleges, and airports where law-abiding citizens are disarmed and left defenseless against criminals who ignore such arbitrary boundaries

- Increase the fee to apply for a Concealed Handgun License."

California Magazine Ban Challenged

Easy come...easy go. That's what many Californians are saying about the one-week long, high-capacity magazine ban that was lifted. The same judge that lifted the ban on March 29, 2019, which has been in place since 2000, then barred further sales on April 5, 2019 until the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals considers whether to reinstate the ban. Fortunately for the thousands of people that purchased the high-cap mags during that week, they will be allowed to keep them without fear of prosecution while the appeal proceeds.

Immediate Range Rule Changes - Bays 7 & 8

Dear Members and Guests,

This email is to inform you of immediate Range Rule changes regarding Bays 7 & 8. There has been an uptick in reports of debris leaving these Bays and landing in other shooting areas, trees, parking lots, etc. The Executive Board and staff are working on long term solutions to this issue. In the interim, we have devised some rules to drastically reduce the likelihood of this occurring.

The new rules regarding Bays 7 & 8 only are:

- No steel targets
- No ground targets
- Bullets must not strike the gravel
- All bullets must strike the REAR BERM above the gravel and no higher

than 6' measured from the Bay floor

- Place your targets within 10 feet (3 big steps) of the rear berm
- EXCEPTION: USPSA and MultiGun Disciplines are allowed to place steel targets in Executive Board specified locations.

Safety Reminders

1. Eye protection - It is now mandatory on all ranges, including the Indoor Range AND all grounds; yes, even if you're not in a bay or shooting. Walking anywhere on the grounds, you can be hit by flying debris. If you are in your vehicle, clubhouse or restrooms, you are not required to wear your eye protection. Prescription glasses are acceptable.
2. Ear protection - Ear protection is mandatory whenever you are around someone who is actively shooting - all bays and all ranges. It's a good idea to also wear ear protection when walking near any shooting area (the corridor between the Main Range and clubhouse can be particularly loud).
3. Gate cards and guest badges - Please wear your gate card on your person where it is visible to everyone and remember to sign in your guests. ARPC does invite the public to participate in regularly scheduled shooting events but we are not open to the public for target practice. Individuals who are not members and not at a scheduled event are trespassing.
