The Executive Board was aware this may vacate the VP position following the election. They chose to follow the constitution as written and wait until the membership voted. The membership voted Jim Gallant to the Chief instructor position causing the VP position to be vacated.

The ARPC executive Board is determining how the position will best be filled for the remainder of the term. It would be helpful for the Executive Board to know who may be interested in volunteering for the position. The Executive Board is forming a committee to review ARPC Discipline policy and provide any recommended changes to the board. The committee will need to review the policy in detail and ensure it meets non-profit business requirements, minimizes work for discipline volunteers, executive board, staff and members. One goal is a balance of use of the facilities and club resources between general membership and discipline membership. The committee will consist of the Executive Board President, Vice President, Treasurer, two members that participate in disciplines and two members that do not regularly participate in disciplines. The policy is large and complicated and will likely require the committee to meet at least once per month for a year. 

## 2019 ARPC Total Safety Infractions By Month



### RSO's and Safety at ARPC: A Look Back At 2019

At the annual ARPC meeting in November, we shared the information that has been collected by our RSO's during their workshifts. For those unable to attend but still interested in how we are doing, I am presenting the 2019 data. It shows an excellent improvement in reduced infractions of our rules, and reflects the good work the RSO's and our members are doing in making this range a safe place for everyone to enjoy. There are 11 types of infractions that we collect data on, though a few are the most common: not wearing eye or ear protection, not having a visible membership card or guest badge, and some gun handling issues. The best way to present this data is to show the total numbers of infractions beginning a year ago, and to see not only how that number has dropped, but how it continues to decline or level out at a very low level. The bump in September and October is likely due to increased range use in preparation for hunting season. Some members only come to the range during this time of year to sight in a rifle, and may not be as aware of our rules and policies. A year ago we were seeing over 300 infractions a month, and we are now down to around 40 a month.

This improvement is due to our RSO program and our New Member Orientation program that are both resulting in a higher member awareness of safe gun handling and safe range behavior. If you see a badge with a green circle with a white check mark it means the member has attended the updated New Member Orientation class and is aware of the newest policies and range rules. Last year (2018) our data was not consistent enough to present a trendline but we are far better now overall with fewer infractions. So we all should appreciate how our RSO's are helping make our range a safe place to shoot for everyone. From the Chief Instructor:

As we have seen with recent news events, having a concealed carry license AND carrying a firearm for self defense can be life saving! Getting a license to carry is the easy part. Continuing to learn and train, so that in the rare event you might need to use your self defense tool, is a lifelong process. Though not a hard and fast rule, many self defense shootings occur within 3 yards, with 3 rounds, and within 3 seconds. In the recent Texas church shooting, within 6 seconds, 3 people were dead, with the last one the shooter himself, killed with a threat-ending head shot from 15 yards. This was from an instructor using a Sig P229 and a .357 Sig round.

In our ARPC sponsored concealed carry classes, you will learn the laws regarding concealed carry, and the safety issues associated with gun ownership. We hope to move beyond these basic courses. The goal being to hone skills through guidance and practice to become confident in making a quick and accurate shot! It is only through continued training and practice that you can perfect the needed skills and experience to be the good guy with the gun. We have Discipline Events such as USPSA, Multi-Gun and Speed Steel that are great venues for keeping tuned up as well. Encourage your friends and family to learn these skills. Mental health issues and criminals will always be around, regardless of how many laws are passed. Let's do what we can to protect ourselves and our loved ones.
