Presidents Annual Meeting Opening Comments and Report

This year has disrupted everything, including the ARPC's Annual Membership Meeting. This newsletter will substitute for the meeting and will contain board members reports, board candidates and proposed constitution changes. For those that regularly attend the annual meeting, I am really hoping ARPC can get back to holding it in November 2021. I have always enjoyed attending the annual meeting to socialize with members of the club and will look forward to it again. I will discuss more how we got here later in my report.

Business at ARPC has done well since last November. Following the annual meeting the board developed a strategic plan for ARPC. It laid out four areas to focus on efforts of the year; improve office procedures, organize constitution/bylaws/policies, improve member retention and control growth and improve input, planning and funding of more shooting opportunities. A detailed report is available of the board strategic planning on the website member's only page.

While there was major disruption to business this year, progress was made in all the strategic planning areas. Office procedures were updated and ARPC has very accurate records of membership and financials that are efficient to maintain. Committees were and are being used to create and review policies. This has been helpful to get membership involvement in policy recommendations to the board. Radio advertising and new member incentives were extremely successful in meeting a membership target, almost too successful. It is good to know now we have tools to control membership numbers but will continue to have to balance it with shooting range availability. We have made huge progress in financial reporting and budgeting, which in turn is helping fund more future shooting opportunities. To help the board in deciding which projects bring the most return to our membership for the cost, range project planning procedures were developed. All the work put into these items is continuing to improve ARPC.

There were two Board changes this year. In January, the Board appointed Tom Christiansen to fill the vacant VP Board position. Tom brought experience and a fresh view to the board that added depth to considerations of club business. In May, the Board appointed Jonathan Wilder to fill the vacated Executive Officer position.

Jonathan previously held the position and was able to continue work on improving project planning procedures.

When the country decided to shut down, there was much concern of the impact it would have to ARPC. While we were in a good position financially, there were many unknowns. I suspected we would have a loss of membership. However, just the opposite happened. Membership has grown. For ARPC it has been a very good year and will help to improve and expand the facilities.

There is a major accomplishment of the board this year I am happy to brag about. One of the reasons I ran for the Board was to improve the clubs financial planning. The Board set a detailed annual budget this year and can monitor it monthly. A major project undertaken by the Treasurer, Dwight Brimley, has given us up to date and comprehensive financial reports of ARPC. Annual budgets can now be set the same as financials are reported. This has a huge impact to how the Board makes decisions. They can now monitor the spending monthly from detailed reports. They will be able to base future budgets off previous year's spending. They can estimate annual income and spending and budget savings for costly improvements years ahead. The financials of this club have never been as transparent and useful as a tool.

Executive Board Election Procedures

The Board's intention was to present Constitutional Amendments at this year's annual Meeting to modify voting procedures and clarify Board limitations. Due to Covid-19, the Annual Meeting has been cancelled. We will be voting on both the Amendments and Board positions electronically. Only members in good standing will be sent voting information. For those of you with email addresses on file, we will send you a link and passcode to vote. For those of you that do not have email or use a computer, we have alternate ways to vote. First, we will provide you with login information and a passcode by mail. You can come to the office with this information and we will provide a computer and assist you. Also you can have a friend assist you on their computer. The window for voting will be November 10th through November 24th, 2020. Results will be announced as soon as possible after the 24th.

Traditionally we have 100 to 200 members attend and vote at the Annual Meeting. That is less than 6% of our membership. By providing the ability to vote electronically, we will have broader membership representation.

Treasurer

Hi, my name is Dwight Brimley and I am running for ARPC treasurer. I have a degree in accounting, and have been working in public and private accounting for the last 36 years. I have been the ARPC treasurer for the last 6 years and in that time we have made great improvements in both the financial condition of the club, and the financial operations. Last year we were finally able to transition to the accrual method of accounting for keeping the ARPC books. In addition to allowing us to make better business decisions to run the club more efficiently, this has allowed us to prepare monthly financial statements. We have also instituted annual budgets for operations and capital spending. These budgets allow us to evaluate our operations and make better, more efficient decisions. As much as our financial processes have improved, we still have room for more improvements. If I am reelected, I will be able to continue improving our processes and making the club better.

Proposed Constitution Amendments

ARTICLE VI - EXECUTIVE BOARD, (A) ELECTED OFFICERS

This recommended constitution change clarifies a member can hold only one board position at a time. If a board member runs as a candidate for another board position they would have to resign from the previous board position if elected to the new position. **The sentence in red is the modification.**

ARTICLE VI - EXECUTIVE BOARD

(A) ELECTED OFFICERS: The Officers of ARPC shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Chief Instructor and Executive Officer who, acting together shall constitute the Executive Board. They shall be elected by a majority vote of the active members in good standing present at the annual meeting of ARPC. They shall hold office for two years. Three of the positions will be elected in even-numbered years. These three will be the President, Vice President and Treasurer. Three of the positions will be elected in odd-numbered years. These three will be Secretary, Chief

ARTICLES III, IV, V, VI, X- OPEN VOTING TO ALL MEMBERSHIP

This recommended constitution change removes the requirement a member must be present at meetings to vote for most membership required votes. These votes include; changing membership year, changing membership fees, awarding honorary memberships, changing family membership fees, changing junior membership fees, work bond fees, electing officers and amendments to the constitution. It does not change the requirement members be present to vote at a membership suspension or expulsion appeal meeting. The quorum required for a vote does not change. It does not specify the type of method of voting.

The changes are highlighted in red or with strike through.

ALBANY RIFLE & PISTOL CLUB & FIREARMS TRAINING FACILITY CONSTITUTION

November 19, 2019

ARTICLE I – NAME

The name of this organization shall be the Albany Rifle & Pistol Club and Firearms Training Facility hereafter known as "ARPC" and is located at 29999 Saddle Butte Rd., Shedd, Oregon, 97377.

ARTICLE II – OBJECTIVE

The objective of this organization shall be training and encouragement of organized shooting among citizens, law enforcement and military personnel of the United States, while encouraging marksmanship, safe firearm handling, and the proper care of firearms. Further, it is our goal to develop characteristics of honesty, good fellowship, self-discipline, team play and self-reliance which are the essentials of good sportsmanship and the foundation of true patriotism.

ARTICLE III – MEMBERSHIP

(A) MEMBERSHIP YEAR: The membership year shall be established by the Executive Board and put to a vote for approval by a majority of members in good standing ~~present at a meeting called for that purpose.~~

(B) TYPES OF MEMBERSHIP: There shall be six types of membership: Individual, Life, Endowment, Family, Junior and Honorary members.

(C) ELIGIBILITY. Any legal resident of the United States may become a member of ARPC after subscribing to the following pledge and upon payment of appropriate membership fees. The pledge of the Albany Rifle and Pistol Club is as follows:

THE PLEDGE I certify that I am a legal resident of the United States of America and that I am not a member of any organization or group which has as any part of its program the attempt to overthrow the Government of the United States or any of its political subdivisions by force or violence; that I have never been convicted of a crime that would not legally allow me to own a firearm and if admitted to membership I will

faithfully endeavor to fulfill the obligations of good sportsmanship and good citizenship.

(D) BENEFITS AND DUTIES:

1. The use of the facilities of ARPC.
2. Competing for places on the various teams, which will represent ARPC in official competitions.
3. A voice and a vote in matters pertaining to the activities and welfare of ARPC as defined herein.
4. It shall be the duty of all members to observe the rules and regulations of ARPC. Further, to conduct themselves in a safe and responsible manner, displaying good sportsmanship, and fair play.
5. To promptly report to the Club officers any infractions of rules by members or visitors which may create an unsafe condition or reflect poorly on ARPC.
6. No member shall be considered to be in good standing who is more than thirty days in arrears in the payment of dues or who has been suspended by proper action of the officers of ARPC.
7. No member shall contract or obligate ARPC to pay fees, bills, or debts except upon approval of the Executive Board.

ARTICLE IV - MEMBERSHIP FEES

(A) INITIATION FEE. All new members (except for endowment, honorary and junior membership) shall pay an initiation fee. Any former member with over a 5 year lapse in membership will be required to pay the initiation fee when reapplying for membership. The Executive Board may waive the initiation fee under certain circumstances.

(B). INDIVIDUAL MEMBERSHIP: The members annual dues shall be established by the Executive Board and put to a vote for approval by a majority of members in good standing ~~present at a meeting called for that purpose~~. Beginning January 1,2012, an annual increase of \$2 per year has been approved. Individual members must be at least 18 years of age.

(C) LIFE MEMBERSHIP: Life memberships shall be open upon decision of the Executive Board. The Executive Board shall set the conditions and cost structure. Life memberships cannot be transferred to other individuals.

(D) ENDOWMENT MEMBERSHIP: Endowment memberships may be granted by the ARPC Executive Board. The Endowment membership fee shall be at least ten(10) times the Life membership fee. Endowment memberships shall be commemorated by special permanent recognition as determined by the Executive Board. Endowment memberships cannot be transferred to other individuals.

(E) HONORARY MEMBERSHIP: Honorary membership may be granted by ARPC in the following manner: Honorary memberships are awarded to nominees by the Executive Board and approved by a majority vote of the membership ~~at any~~

~~membership meeting~~. Honorary membership is awarded as recognition of a special benefit or service to ARPC. Honorary members are non-voting and are not eligible to be elected as club officers.

(F) FAMILY MEMBERSHIPS: Will be granted to a family unit, living within the same household. The fee for such a membership shall be established by the Executive Board and put to a vote for approval by a majority of members in good standing ~~present at a meeting called for that purpose~~. Beginning January 1, 2012, an annual increase of \$3 per year has been approved. Each Family membership will have only 1 vote. All members within a family membership, holding active gate cards must be at least 18 years of age.

(G) JUNIOR MEMBERSHIP: Available to juniors under the age of 18 who are involved in shooting activities at ARPC. The fee for such a membership shall be established by the Executive Board and put to a vote for approval by a majority of members in good standing ~~present at a meeting called for that purpose~~. All Junior members must be supervised by an adult member. Junior members are non-voting and are not eligible to be elected as club officers.

(H) BENEFACTOR STATUS: Any ARPC member can add benefactor status to their membership by donating money or possessions to ARPC by vote of the Executive Board. This special status will be recognized by giving the member a permanent name tag that designates the level of benefactor status and a plaque on the "Benefactor Wall of Recognition". Benefactors will be recognized in the following levels: Benefactor - \$500 to \$1,000 Bronze Benefactor - \$1,001 to \$2,500 Silver Benefactor - \$2,501 to \$5,000 Gold Benefactor - \$5,001 to \$7,500 Platinum Benefactor - \$7,501 to \$10,000 Diamond Benefactor - \$10,001 and up

(I) WORK BOND: Every new member pays the work bond fee when they join ARPC and it can be waived from that point forward by completing approved club work during the membership year. A member of ARPC can choose to pay the Work Bond fee each year instead of working the mandated hours for the club. Levels of work bond fees shall be established by the Executive Board and put to a vote for approval by a majority of the members in good standing ~~present at a meeting called for that purpose~~. The Executive Board may waive the Work Bond fee under certain circumstances.

(J) ARREARS: No member of ARPC shall be eligible to vote or enjoy any privileges or benefits of ARPC who is not a member in good standing.

ARTICLE V – MEETINGS

(A) ANNUAL MEETINGS: The annual meeting of ARPC shall be held in the month of November each year.

(B) MEMBERSHIP MEETINGS: A membership meeting of ARPC shall be held at least once in each quarter of the calendar year to conduct business at such time and place as may be fixed by the Executive Board.

(C) SPECIAL MEETINGS: A special meeting of ARPC may be held at any time upon the call of the President or upon the call of the Executive Board or upon demand in writing, stating the object of the proposed meeting, and signed by not less than 5% of the members in good standing. Notice of the time, place and object of any special meeting shall be given to all officers and members in good standing in writing by United States mail, electronically or in person not less than fifteen days prior to the

date fixed for the holding of the meeting. The place of such a special meeting shall be fixed by the Executive Board.

(D) Quorum: At least 1.5 % of members in good standing but no less than 20, including the Executive Board, shall constitute a quorum at any membership meeting **or vote**.

(E) The default day for the Executive Board meetings shall be the second Tuesday of the month. Only by a unanimous vote of the Executive Board may the day be changed. Upon the election of the new board the default is reinstated.

ARTICLE VI - EXECUTIVE BOARD

(A) ELECTED OFFICERS: The Officers of ARPC shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Chief Instructor and Executive Officer who, acting together shall constitute the Executive Board. They shall be elected by a majority vote of the active members in good standing **present at the for the** annual meeting of ARPC. They shall hold office for two years. Three of the positions will be elected in even-numbered years. These three will be the President, Vice President and Treasurer. Three of the positions will be elected in odd-numbered years. These three will be Secretary, Chief Instructor and Executive Officer.

(B) DUTIES: The Executive Board shall have general supervision, control of employee hiring, performance reviews and disciplinary actions, control of all other ARPC activities, and the financial responsibility for ARPC.

(C) MEETINGS: Meetings of the Executive Board shall be held at least once in each quarter of the calendar year at such time and place as the Board may determine. Special meetings may be held at any time on the call of the President or on demand, in writing to the Secretary, by three members of the Board.

(D) QUORUM: Four members of the Board shall constitute a quorum.

(E) RESIGNATION: Resignation of any officer may be accepted by a majority vote of the remaining members of the Executive Board.

(F) VACANCIES: A vacancy in the Executive Board may be filled by a majority vote of the remaining members of the Board. However, if more than one vacancy exists, a special meeting of ARPC members, in good standing, shall be called and new officers shall be elected to fill the vacancies until the date of the next annual meeting a provided in paragraph (A) above.

(G) EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR: The Executive Board shall appoint an Executive Director to carry out the day to day operation of ARPC. The Executive Director will be responsible to manage ARPC's staff, programs, expansion, and execution of its mission. The Executive Director reports directly to the Executive Board through the Executive Board President.

ARTICLE VII - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

(A) PRESIDENT: The President shall preside at all membership and Executive Board meetings. He / She shall be a member ex officio of all committees and shall perform all other duties as usually pertain to his / her office.

(B) VICE PRESIDENT: The Vice President shall perform the duties of the President

in his / her absence or at his / her request and shall oversee all shooting disciplines.

(C) SECRETARY: The Secretary shall keep a true record of all meetings and have custody of the books and papers of the club, except the Treasurers books of account.

(D) TREASURER: The Treasurer shall have charge of all funds of ARPC and place the same in such bank or banks as may be approved by the Executive Board. Such money shall be withdrawn by check/voucher signed by the Treasurer or designated Executive Board appointed person (s) for the payment of such bills as have been approved by the Executive Board. The Treasurer shall be responsible for an accurate account of all transactions and render a detailed report with vouchers at any meeting of the Executive Board, when requested, and an annual report to the organization at its annual meeting.

(E) CHIEF INSTRUCTOR: The Chief Instructor shall oversee all ARPC firearms /safety instruction programs with authority to appoint his / her assistants as approved by the Executive Board.

(F) EXECUTIVE OFFICER: The Executive Officer shall oversee all ARPC ranges, property and facilities. He / She shall have the authority to appoint his / her assistants as approved by the Executive Board.

ARTICLE VIII - SUSPENSION OR EXPULSION

(A) OFFICERS: Any officer may be removed by a two-thirds vote of the members in good standing present at any special meeting called for this purpose. Reference Article V Section C. No vote on suspension or removal may be taken unless at least fifteen days notice in writing shall have been given to the officer regarding the reasons for their removal, and including the date, time and place of the special meeting at which such ballot of their removal is to be taken. At such a special meeting the officer shall be given a full hearing on the written charges. No additional charges may be presented or considered at this meeting without the express consent of the officer charged.

(B) MEMBERS: Any member may be suspended or expelled from the organization for any cause deemed sufficient by the Executive Board by a two-thirds affirmative vote of the members of the Board. No vote on suspension or expulsion may be taken unless at least fifteen days notice in writing shall have been given to the member against which the charges were preferred, and of the date, time and place of the meeting of the Executive Board at which such charges will be considered. At such a meeting the member charged will be accorded a full hearing on the written charges. No new charges may be introduced or heard at this meeting without the express consent of the member charged.

(C) CHARGES: Charges against any officer or member may be preferred by any member in good standing. They shall be in writing, clearly stating the facts relied upon and accompanied by all affidavits or exhibits, which are to be used in their support. Such charges shall be filed with the Secretary who will immediately notify the President. The President will call a meeting of the Executive Board to hear the charges. The Secretary will give at least fifteen days notice of the meeting to each member of the Executive Board, the accuser and to the accused. Such notice shall be in writing and will include a true copy of the charges, supporting affidavits and exhibits.

(D) APPEAL: Any member suspended or expelled by the Executive Board may appeal to the full membership of the organization. Such appeal shall be made to the Secretary

in writing, who will notify the President. The President will call a special meeting of the organization for the purpose of acting on the appeal. The Secretary shall give at least fifteen days notice in writing to all members of the organization in good standing. The notice shall include the date, time, place and reason for such a special meeting. At the meeting the Secretary will read the original charges, the supporting affidavit, any accompanying exhibits and the minutes of the special meeting or the Executive Board at which the charges were heard and action taken. A full hearing will be given to the accuser and the accused. A vote will be taken by ballot of the members in good standing present. A two-thirds vote shall be required to reverse the action of the Executive Board.

(E) TESTIMONY: All testimony at hearings on charges against officers or members shall be under oath. The President or other presiding officer will swear in the witnesses who give verbal testimony. Affidavits or expositions sworn before a notary public or other officer authorized by law to give oaths in court proceedings shall be acceptable as evidence.

ARTICLE IX - ROBERTS RULES

All meetings of ARPC and of the Executive Board will be conducted in accordance with the revised Robert's Rules of Order.

ARTICLE X - AMENDMENTS

Amendments to this Constitution may be introduced by any member, in good standing, of ARPC at any regular meeting or special meeting called for that purpose. The Executive Board will review and make recommendations to the membership. Upon recommendation of the Executive Board, the amendment(s) will be acted upon by ARPC membership ~~at a special meeting called for that purpose~~. A copy of the proposed amendment(s) will be sent to each club member by United States mail or sent electronically at least ten days prior to ~~the meeting a call for vote~~. A majority vote of the ~~returned ballots active members present~~ will be necessary to approve any amendment(s).

ARTICLE XI - DISSOLUTION

Upon recommendation of dissolution by the Executive Board a special meeting of the membership will be called for that purpose and a vote for dissolution will be taken. In the event ARPC is dissolved or discontinued, either by act of the Corporation or by operation of law, the assets of the organization shall be transferred to an NRA affiliated shooting range / Gun Club in the State of Oregon as determined by the membership provided, however, that in no event shall any member of this organization derive a profit or receive any part of the assets of the corporation upon dissolution or distribution thereof pursuant to this Article.

ARTICLE XII – BYLAWS

The ARPC Executive Board, by a majority vote of officers present at any Executive Board meeting, shall have the power to create and/or amend procedures for the operation, conduct of meetings, committees and competitions not in conflict with this Constitution. These procedures shall be known as Bylaws. The procedure to create a Bylaw shall be: A Board member will present the proposed Bylaw to the Board. The motion to accept the proposal will state this is a Bylaw. The Secretary will record it in the minutes as a Bylaw.

As CI, this last year, I have focused on making the RSO program even better. We have more RSO's, and are covering most of the available time slots. Most of the RSO's are now trained in Trauma First Aid, and those who are wearing the red caps, ARPC RSO, have taken the trauma refresher course and are trained in using the trauma kits that ARPC supplies. We will continue to recruit more RSO's, though we are nearing our capacity. We lose some when they move away from the area.

Our New Member Orientation has been increased in frequency to meet the increased demand.

The Basic Pistol Class and Combined Utah/Oregon Concealed Carry classes are running smoothly and are well attended by both members and non-members, with the later beginning to join the club following the class.

This next year we have projected to accomplish the following goals:

- Review and update all range rules
- Review all existing training at our range, and develop an updated policy to manage them, focusing on safety, and compliance with our existing bylaws and policies
- We will be expanding our ARPC training classes to include intermediate and more advanced pistol skills, a basic rifle course, and a Trauma/First Aid class for general members.

This last year has been a challenge with the health concerns and economic impacts that resulted from them. Next year, I expect, we will still need to be aware of safe practices to protect our members and to remain in compliance with state policies. We are all looking forward to the end of the current health crisis and are hoping that the economy will recover to pre-pandemic levels as soon as it is able. ARPC stayed open the entire time by careful planning and adherence to the mandates. Yes, we were closed by the fire threats and smoke hazards, but fortunately, fall rains have ended that concern. Executive Director Report

We have had an interesting year dominated by Covid-19. We developed policies on how to keep our range open and maintained. Productivity has suffered with the required adaptations but we have still provided a safe and clean range for you throughout the year. This year we started billing for renewals, new memberships and range use through QuickBooks. This allows a member to renew directly from an email by entering their credit card information and submitting the payment. They then receive a paid receipt by email. We still contact our members by snail mail if we do not have an email address. We did not take on any major range projects this year but did wrap up some odds and ends from 2019. The ADA work we did for the Main Range, Clubhouse, Indoor Range and Office area in 2019 has really been appreciated by our members. The ADA parking and ramps are used daily and it is very heartwarming to know we have made it a little easier for our membership to access our facility. All future projects will evaluate ADA and other regulatory requirements as part of the design phase. We hope to make progress on range expansion over the next few years. We are currently surveying our range to develop a topo plan to assist in future expansions.
