Pro Shop/Office

All popular reloading components are very hard to obtain so expect shortages.

Membership Account Access

We are utilizing QuickBooks Online to simplify the renewal and New Member process. This is a simple and safe system to use. We will email you an invoice. With a few simple clicks and your credit card information your dues will be paid. You will receive an emailed receipt showing your dues are paid. You can also mail us a check or pay in person. As an ARPC member you have access to your own section of the website. In that section you can update your mailing address and email address. Forgotten your login information? No problem. Main Rifle Range Etiquette

Our Main Range cease fire procedures are controlled by the members on the range. There have been a few questions regarding best practices so here is a reasonable and equitable way to share the Main Range. The key on busy days is balance between quality shooting time and the opportunity to hang targets. Do not expect the range to go cold as soon as you arrive. If the range just went hot you should expect the range to remain hot for at least 20 minutes. Get all your gear set up and then ask a member when the last ceasefire was called. If it's been 20 minutes or more, start the process to go cold. If you are unsure of the process there are detailed instructions above the control buttons located at the green striped range access areas. You should expect the range to remain hot for at least 20 minutes once the range goes hot again. If asked to go

cold by a newly arrived member, explain that the range just went hot and you would be happy to go cold in 15 to 20 minutes. If this etiquette is followed all members should get both a quality shooting experience and have the ability to hang or pull targets.

Trauma First Aid Class

ARPC is now offering a First Aid Class. This class is intended for those who participate in shooting sports. We will cover common injuries as well as penetrating injuries. Students will learn to use a tourniquet, chest seals, pressure packing dressings, and other components of many popular IFAK's (individual first aid kits). This is a hands-on class! This 5-hour class will be offered with a fee of \$100 for members of ARPC and \$125 for non-members. Non-members will receive a \$25 off certificate for New Member Initiation fees. Also, we will make available for purchase, at our price an IFAK product that we have found appropriate for our RSO's. Our instructor is a certified, licensed EMT, and experienced instructor who we have used for our RSO program for many years now. Everyone who has taken this class has felt that it is of great value, so we opened it up to anyone interested.

Please note that one of the training devices is a Pigs shoulder and you should wear clothing that you are comfortable getting dirty.

Level 1 Handgun.

AR Level 1

This is a 5 hour class and will review AR Fundamentals class material and build on that while focusing on the AR-15 model.

The class fee will be \$100 for members and \$125 for non-members. Non-members will receive a \$25 Off Discount Certificate off New Member Initiation fees. Sign up and payment is done online. The class can be cancelled within 48 hours of the scheduled class if there is insufficient attendance. If the class is cancelled, there will be an opportunity to reschedule the missed class or take part in the next scheduled class. Participants will need to bring their own AR-15, 100 Rounds of new ammo, .223/5.56 ONLY (No reloads, green tips, or armor piercing). which will be inspected by the instructor prior to class.

Participants will need to bring hearing and eye protection and wear appropriate clothing for weather and training.

The need for hunter education classes is as critical as ever. The Covid-19 pandemic has gotten more and more people interested in outdoor activities like hunting and shooting. On top of that, roughly 3,000 students were given an exemption for completing the field day portion of their independent study course work so they could hunt in the 2020 season when many classes were cancelled or drastically reduced in size. These students are now in need of completing their field day courses and range time so that they can hunt in the 2021 season.

Hunter Education is a crucial step in the process of hunter recruitment, retention, and reactivation. For many adults and families, hunting and shooting is a new and exciting activity that they are just getting into. Hunter education is a great way to

introduce these families and individuals to safe hunting and shooting activities.

If you've ever thought about becoming an instructor, now is a great time to jump in. If you enjoy working with great kids and their families, you will find hunter education to be very rewarding.

If you are not ready to lead a class or become an instructor you now have the option of volunteering as a hunter education support person. Many times, classes just need additional adults present to maintain two-deep leadership with the students. To insure the safety of the students, instructors are not allowed to work with youth without an additional adult being present.

GSSF does not require the expensive equipment and extensive training that most other firearms competitions do. Started in 1991, GSSF has grown to include over 22,000 active members and now organizes over 50 outdoor and 60 indoor shooting matches each year. Almost anyone can join GSSF but if you want to participate in a sanctioned sport shooting match you must be a member and compete with a GLOCK pistol. The only other requirement is to have fun!
